ORIENTALS DROWN BY HUNDREDS

IN FLOOD IN CHINA

PROPERTY DAMAGE IN THE MILLIONS — KWANG TUNG RIVER STILL ON RAMPAGE— THOUSANDS ARE HOMELESS.

(United Press Leased Wire.)
Hong Kong, July 3.—Intense suffering exists in the flooded region of southern China, according to reports received here today. The Kwank Tung river is still on a rampage and the damage already amounts to millions of dollars.

Relief funds are being raised here and quantities of food have been sent to relieve the thousands of persons left homeless by the raging waters. The death list has mounted high into the hundreds and will probably reach thousands before the waters recede.

The government has appropriated \$20,000 to be expended in caring for the refugees and the Standard Oil company has contributed \$5000 cash to the relief fund.

Japan to Rescue.

Tokio, July 3.—Ignoring the bitter commercial feud existing between the two countries, wealthy Japanese are subscribing thousands of dollars today to a fund which be sent to China to relieve the suffering resulting from the flood on the Kwang Tung river, in which hundreds of persons were drowned and thousands left homeless in the destroyed cities.

Although their business has been injured to the extent of many thousand dollars by the Chinese boycott on Japanese goods, the merchants of Tokio were among the first to contribute to the fund for the assistance of the sufferers in southern China.

foreign secretary and the state department this afternoon, when the news was received here that Tabriz was being sacked by a horde of cossacks of the shah's army. The government is seriously considering intervening at once to put a stop to the outrages. The shah will be forced to admit that he has no control over his troops or that he deliberately broke the compact entered into between Rachin Khan and the British legation at Tabriz before the Persian force entered the city. Either alternative would prove unpleasant for the shah.

Britain in common, with Austria, regards the attitude of the czar with suspicion. It is felt here that Russian cossacks, who had been assisting the Persians rebels in Tabriz before the city was surrendered, were responsible for the starting of the massacre. The general opinion here is that Russia, who would profit by the massacre, is not sorry that it took place and may use this as a pretext to send troops for a landing grab in northern Persia.

Tabriz Not Surprised

Vienna, July 3.—News of the Persian massacre at Tabriz was received with no surprise at the foreign offices here tonight. Government officials will make no comment on the situation in the Caucasus but do not hide their feeling of apprehension that Russian is planning a coup in northern Persia. But few particulars of the massacre have been received here.

WEALTHY MAN IS PROBABLY A SUICIDE

San Francisco, July 3.—Detectives investigating the death of Hugo Rothchild, a wealthy business man who was asphyxiated in his office last night, believe today that he committed suicide. No reason can be assigned for his self-destruction, but the circumstances surrounding the case make the theory of accidental death improbable.

had been killed and over 700 wounded by the fighting.

When the English representatives at Tabriz heard that terms of surrender were being negotiated, they hurried to Kahn and warned him that if a massacre took place, Great Britain would intervene. Kahn promised to see to it that no disorder followed the entry of the victorious army into the captured city and a truce was arranged.

Shortly after the cossacks entered the city, trouble started in a drinking bout in the Haban quarter. A small riot there quickly spread to other parts of the city and the shah's cossacks ran through the city crying "Kill the rebels."

The cry was taken up by soldiers in all parts of the city. Someone applied a torch to the drinking place in which the trouble started and another cossack killed the wife of the proprietor and ran through the streets with the severed head on his scimitar.

Incensed at the sight, the rebels, who had promised to maintain peace, took to arms. Pillaging, fighting and looting followed. The cossacks, most of whom were armed with superior swords and guns, had the upper hand. They broke into houses and dragged crying women and children into the street. Sometimes they killed them outright and sometimes they tortured them to make sport for their drunken comrades.

All attempts at restoring order have proved useless. The army of the shah has been turned by the thirst for blood into a howling mob. The city tonight is partially destroyed by fire and presents a horrible spectacle. The bodies of slaughtered women and children are piled in heaps at the corners and even in death are made the subject for jest by the drunken mob of soldiers that is in complete control of the city.

The government here is seriously considering the advisability of rushing troops from the Caucasus to Persia to restore order.
