U. S. HIGHEST MOUNTAIN IS IN NEVADA

(United Press Lensed Wire.)
Reno, Nev., July 3.—That Mount Jeff Davis, in White Pine county, Nev., is the highest mountain in the United States was announced today by State Engineer Nicholas who also confirms the story of "The Spectacle of Brockton" heretofore believed to be a myth. While on the top of the mountain, which he measured as 14,705 feet high, 200 feet higher than any other peak in the country. Nicholas was able to see an image greatly magnified, in the clouds about his head. A band of Indians told of this phenomena years ago when they were scared away from the peak by the uncanny sight but, until Engineer Nicholas confirmed the story, it was generally discredited. The government has official record of a mountain in Germany where a similar condition prevails. Nicholas declares his intention to return to Mount Jeff Davis and discover the cause of the mirage.
