Character and quality will count **FOR AS MUCH IN GREEN FRUIT AS IN ANY OTHER PRODUCT.** Cured prunes are a manufactured product and there will be prizes for excellence here as in all lines of production.

### FOR FREE LOCKS AND CANAL.

The Oregon delegation all promise there shall be something done to secure free locks and canal at Oregon City. The state has taken the initiative and appropriated \$300,000 for the purpose of **HELPING CONGRESS TO BUY THE LOCKS AND CANAL AT OREGON CITY.** One hundred thousand dollars has already been levied and collected and is in the state treasury for this purpose, as a result of the Jones bill.

### CONGRESSMAN HAWLEY HAS INTRODUCED A BILL TO MAKE THE NECESSARY APPROPRIATION FOR THIS PURPOSE.

The Fulton resolution passed the senate directing a new estimate to be made of the cost of acquiring the locks and canal. Congressman Ellis of Eastern Oregon feels grateful for the kind

words said for him in this part of the state and writes:

"In regard to free locks and canal will say I am earnestly in favor of **ANY MEASURE THAT WILL BRING THAT ABOUT** at an early day, and will willingly and cheerfully work hand in hand with Hawley in behalf of this much needed work."

Following is the text of a plank in the last Republican platform, and to which the whole state is committed:

"This convention approves the action of the last legislature in passing the Jones bill to secure free locks and canal at Oregon City by the co-operation of the state and national government. We urge our delegation in congress and the United States senate to make this a foremost issue to the end that the farmers and shippers of the Willamette valley may be relieved of the tax of 50 CENTS PER TON NOW LEVIED ON ALL COMMERCE OF WESTERN OREGON BY A PRIVATE CORPORATION to the great financial injury of the industries and manufacturing enterprises that demand competition in freight rates, which is impossible without a free and open waterway."

That is why art galleries with sculpture figures in the nude have a positive public educational value.

**IT WILL PAY ANY FATHER OR MOTHER TO TAKE THEIR CHILDREN THROUGH THE ART GALLERY AT PORTLAND** and see the plaster casts of the great master pieces.

On the other hand it is not necessary **TO MAKE THESE BEAUTIFUL WORKS OF HUMAN ART TOO COMMON.**

It is manifestly improper to illustrate school books with prints of the nude statuary of the classical ages of Greeks or Roman or modern French art.

Few of the famous paintings are found proper for school children. Less than 10 per cent of the gods, goddesses and other mythological characters portrayed by the old masters were sufficiently clothed **TO PASS MUSTER FOR BOOKS USED IN THE SCHOOLS.**

Their Adonises and Psyches were underlaid for the purpose, their Zeuses were mostly in the same category, and so down the long list of Prometheus, Pandora, Epimetheus, Philémon, Athene, Poseidon, Arachne, Aphrodite, Atlanta and the rest.

Eros, of course, is a privileged character, but Admetus of the old canvases, Daphne and Appoio, Niobe and even Midas **WERE SO SHY OF ATTIRE THAT IT HAS BEEN FOUND NECESSARY TO BAR THEM ALSO.**

This disclosure follows upon a painstaking search among the masterpieces for a representative lot of mythological subjects to illustrate a supplementary readers.

The tendency of the day in education is to make the Greek myths familiar to children even of the lower grades, but when the Prang company set about the illustration of a book, "Greek Myths and their Art," **THEY ENCOUNTERED UNFOUNDED DIFFICULTIES.**

European galleries were searched for works of old masters which would do, but of a total of hundreds of pictures only a score were found properly garbed to pass the scrutiny of hesitating school boards.

The greatest difficulty was found in securing an Athene who looked the part and who also appeared in costume.

Aphrodite and Daphne, too, **WERE GENERALLY POSED IN "THE ALTOGETHER."**

Of course propriety for the juveniles and propriety for the elders were two different things; so were the standards of propriety in the days of Raphael and of present day school trustees.

The final collection of pictures for the book is one of the most interesting because of the difficulties in the finding of them.

They were given to carry out the idea of the author, Charles E. Mann, a western educator now deceased, who had written in his preface: "All the best paintings and sculpture of the Greeks themselves **LOOKED TO THEIR MYTHS FOR INSPIRATION,** and in modern art also are to be found works of the highest excellence from the same motives, so that any adequate appreciation of such subjects is quite impossible without a knowledge of the Greek myths."

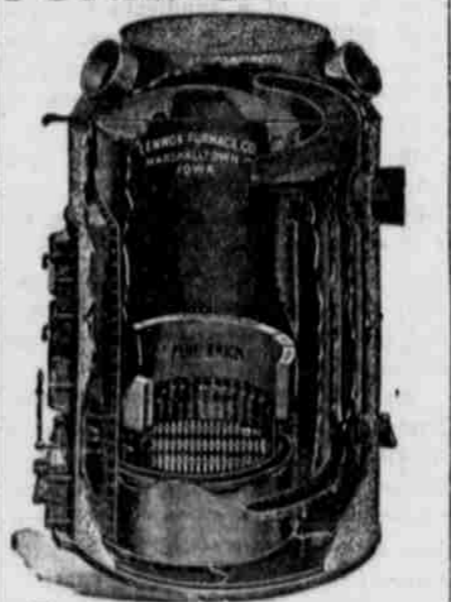
