### THE REAL ISSUE IN THE NEXT LEGISLATURE.

It is not whether Republicans shall elect a Democrat to the senate from Oregon.

**REPUBLICANS WHO READ NOTHING BUT THE OREGONIAN** may be made to believe that. But those who will consider the history of the state and nation know the issue is far deeper than that.

Well read citizens in all parties know that **THE OLD SYSTEM OF ELECTING UNITED STATES SENATORS HAS BROKEN DOWN.**

They know that the most progressive states in the Union are turning away from that system in disgust.

In few states in the north have legislatures been pure enough **TO BE FREE FROM THE TAINT OF CORRUPTION** in the election of senators.

The notorious conditions that have prevailed in Oregon require little further exploiting.

Well informed citizens know that other states besides Oregon have adopted **THE DIRECT PRIMARY AND DIRECT ELECTION OF SENATORS.**

Wisconsin, Iowa, Oklahoma, and many of the southern states have adopted direct nomination and direct election of U. S. senators.

Many cities like Des Moines, Iowa, Los Angeles, Cal.; Galveston, Texas, and others have adopted **DIRECT NOMINATION, DIRECT LEGISLATION AND THE RECALL.**

Those reform ideas are not partisan, and cannot be called Populism or Democracy, and calling names is not argument.

In some of the Southern states the laws provide for even a **SECOND OR THIRD PRIMARY ELECTION.**

The Southern states have not been

noted for senatorial scandals, except in the states that do not have the direct primary.

The horror of Democrats having a vote in electing a senator in Oregon is **FAR-FETCHED.**

The first two United States senators elected from Oregon were Nesmith, a Douglas Democrat, and Logan, a Lincoln Republican.

**IT TOOK DEMOCRATIC VOTES TO BRING THAT ABOUT** and the state never had cause to regret what was done in those days.

It was the brightest spot in the political record of Nesmith that he voted for all the war measures of a Republican president.

Never but once was Senator Mitchell chosen senator **WITHOUT THE HELP OF DEMOCRATIC VOTES.**

We regret to say that at times it took money to accomplish results in the good old days, and even Democrats and Populists were not above taking the product of the Mazuma mine.

It is a matter of record **AND TESTIMONY HAS BEEN MADE PUBLIC TO PROVE** that members of the legislature sold their votes for senator in bunches.

Those bunches included Democrats, Republicans and Populists, and the system was even more reprehensible when the source of the money is considered.

The hired influences of the corporations in Oregon are at work to defeat the popular choice of senators.

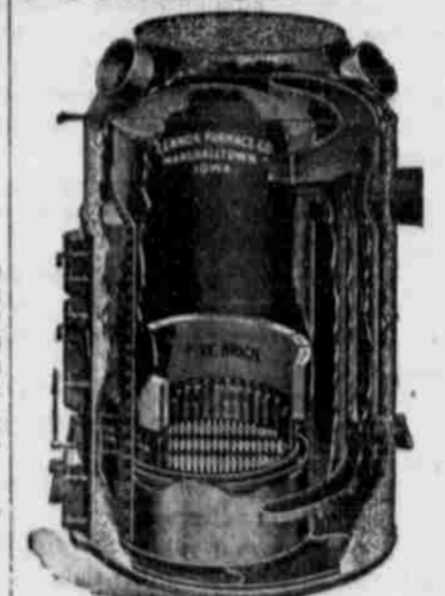
