

# CHINATOWN WILL TAKE PART IN CHERRY FAIR

From Cooke Patton of the Cherry Fair comic parade committee comes the announcement that Salem's Chinatown will turn out en masse to participate in the great mirth provoking feature of the carnival. The Oriental section of the Cherry City will be represented by three floats, a full Chinese orchestra, and a marching club of half a hundred Celestials garbed in resplendent holiday attire.

This will be a feature, the like of which has never been seen or even attempted in Salem or any other city in Oregon. Practically the whole of Chinatown will be there. The decorations for the floats will be brought from Portland, and an agent of the Chinese residents of this city is now negotiating for the purchase of the expensive Oriental material that will be seen in the parade.

The arrangements for the magnificent display are under the management of no less a personage than Lai Yick, the progressive Chinese gentleman, late of the famous High Street noodle cafe, but now a full-fledged doctor and dispenser of Oriental herbs, which, according to his advertisements are "unknown to American physicians, and guaranteed to cure, or no pay." Yick is busy taking up subscriptions to meet the expenses of the parade, and all the Chinese, he says, will contribute liberally. To see this feature is in itself worth the trouble and expense of 100 miles of travel, and those who miss it will be the recipients of a life-long regret.

More than 35 features have already been entered in the comic parade, and more are to follow. Two other new attractions, which have just been announced, are the primitive Indian, and the German band. Both of these will be a whole circus in themselves.

The primitive Indian will be impersonated by one of Salem's representative merchants, and according to Cooke Patton, this person will be garbed in as primitive a costume as was ever donned by a savage. Aside from his head gear the Indian will wear about 15 cents worth of clothing.

The German band will excite the wonder and admiration of all beholders. The streets will ring with the old time airs of the Fatherland, which the musicians have been practicing for the past several days. Yesterday the whole band went out in the woods several miles from Salem to rehearse, and they are now fully prepared to give the spectators their money's worth of genuine amusement.

Every comic feature of Arnole's big carnival company will also participate in the parade. Efforts are also being made to have the Japanese contingent of the Cherry City take part in the procession. A prize of \$5 has been offered for the

best feature in the comic parade, and it is probable that other prizes will be announced later. The parade will start from the city hall promptly at 7 o'clock Saturday evening.

In regard to the great floral parade, the details as arranged by the committee show that it will eclipse anything that has ever been seen in Salem. A special decorator is in the city, and is spending much of his time in the work of preparing the big wagons for the procession. Besides the prizes that were published last week, three new ones were announced last evening. Fred Waters, of the new Electric Fixture company, has offered a \$15 electric stand lamp for the best decorated automobile in the parade, and the Cherry Fair committee has offered a prize of \$10 for the best decorated buggy or carriage, and \$5 for the second best.

Four more days only remain until the Cherry Fair, the preparations for which have been going on unceasingly for weeks. The necessary postponement of the event has served only to make the celebration bigger and grander, and every indication points to the fact that the 1908 Cherry Fair will be a whirlwind held at any place or at any history of horticultural exhibitions.

At the meeting of the several committees at the Board of Trade rooms Saturday evening all arrangements for the occasion were practically completed. Scores of growers have expressed their intentions of outdoing themselves this year in the matter of exhibits and some of them have promised to be on hand with unique displays of a character not seen in the fairs of 1906 and 1907. If this is done, and the growers that have been in communication with the Cherry Fair committee keep their promises, the fair this year will far surpass the exhibitions of last year and the year before, which were pronounced by horticulturalists the country over as the greatest events of their kind time.

This is a fact of which every citizen in Marion and Polk counties should be justly proud. Salem is the Cherry City of the world. The cherry growers are responsible for its reputation as such, and they alone can and should see to it that its enviable reputation and fame is sustained this week. Let every grower in this section of the country make an exhibit. It matters not how small his individual display may be, it is his duty to be on hand with the goods.

The pavilion which is being erected on the west side of the court house lawn is well under way, and will be completed before Thursday. There will be something doing every minute in the big pavilion. The Stalwart quartett will be there and
