The Naval Fever in Germany.

At the present rate of sailing, Germany in 1911 will equal England in battleships of the Dreadnought type; this root fact is the one with which the rulers of our country are confronted in the immediate future, and the Germans, greatly cheered by the fact that England would welcome limitation of armament, are straining every nerve to arrive at that basis of equality which has been their end and aim all the time. It is not recognized in this country what strides the idea of sea-power is making in the fatherland, and how skillfully engineered are the efforts of the Flottenverein, or German Navy League; in membership alone this mighty and militant confederation numbers one million and eighteen thousand-odd persons; if we take the population of the German empire at sixty millions this shows that rather more than one person in every sixty belongs to the league, and it must be remembered that its patron is the Emperor William, its president is Prince Henry of Prussia. When it oversteps the limits of discretion and engages in electioneering it can be, and was, disavowed by the authorities; none the less, it is the most potent factor for the advance of Pan-Germanic ideas. It is barely two years and a half ago, in December, 1905, that the league collected 400,000 signatures to a petition drawn up by its chairman praying the Reichstag for a more rapid increase in the fleet. The spread of information concerning the comparative weakness of the German navy never ceases, as the finances of the league are principally devoted to this end. The journal of the league, Die Flotte, has a circulation running to hundreds of thousands; there are 53 central committees, 3006 local committees and 2924 delegates, or confidential agents, who spread broadcast leaflets with such titles as "The Peasant and the Navy," "The Use of a Navy to a German Artisan," "What a Young German Should Know About the Navy," etc. Everywhere the dictum of the emperor that "the future of Germany is on the sea" is preached, and from members of parliament to school children the people never cease having this dinned into their ears.—Pall Mall Gazette.
