The Cherry Fair championship baseball game Thursday will be between an Albany team and the Chemawa Indians. The teams played once before, when the Indians won. The club boys are determined to win this time, and no doubt the lovers of the sport will witness a game worth while. Friday's game will be between the Salem Fairmounts and the Turner team. Turner has a very strong team, headed by Curtis Coleman. They have defeated strong teams from Jefferson, Stayton and Marion, and last year defeated Fairmount. The management has been fortunate in securing such a strong combination. Clarence Bishop has entire charge of the games, all of which will be held on the Willamette field. The winner of the two games will play for a championship trophy on Saturday.

Supreme Court Decisions.

Besides the case of F. I. McKenna v. the City of Portland which was reversed by Chief Justice Bean, the following decisions were handed down by the supreme court:

Quartz Gold Mining Company v. C. A. Patterson, motion for dismissal denied by court.

William M. Manning v. Portland Ship Building company, appealed from a decision of Judge A. L. Fraser in Multnomah county, affirmed in an opinion by Justice Eakin.

George W. Fredericks v. Antone Klausner, appealed from Baker county, modified in an opinion by Justice Moore.

D. McMillan and J. D. Honeyman v. E. F. Batten and others, appealed from a decision by Judge A. L. Fraser in Crook county, affirmed in an opinion by Commissioner Slater.

I. N. Maxwell v. P. L. Fraser and Fred Hurst, appealed from a decision by Judge Galloway in Marion county, reversed in an opinion by Justice Eakin.

Petition for rehearing in the case of Mark Rush v. Oregon Water Power & Electric Railway company denied.
