DEALERS IN GIRLS CAUGHT

(United Press Leased Wire.)
Chicago, July 16.—Sam Gee and Geo Fong, two Chinese, are in prison today accused of conducting a clearing house through which white girls have been sold into slavery to Oriental masters. It is alleged that 27 American women are now held prisoners by local Chinese and steps are being taken to effect their rescue.

Knowledge of the white slave traffic, which has been carried on secretly here for months, reached the police through Isabel Held, a beautiful 17-year-old girl. Miss Held ran into the police station last night and sobbed out her story to Lieutenant Joel Smith. She told of being abducted and sold as a slave to a Chinese master. Last night she made her escape and reported the sale of 27 other white girls to Orientals. It is believed the raid that is being planned will result in clearing the mystery which has surrounded the disappearance of a number of girls during the past few months.

CLARK COUNTY PRUNE CROP IS LIGHT

(Roseburg News.)
A careful investigation of the prune crop in Clark county has been made by an experienced buyer, says the Portland Oregonian, who estimates about half a crop this year. Conditions are spotted in the county, some orchards doing fairly well and others poorly. The prunes will run to the large sizes. The only harm that could come to the crop now would be rains during the drying season, which will begin about September 10.

In the Willamette valley conditions are better than in Clark county.

The crop will be heavier than was first expected, probably 75 per cent of a normal yield. The total output of the Northwest is figured at about two-thirds of a crop.

Prune growers are reluctant to sell, now at the prices offered them, feeling that the situation is strong enough to justify higher prices, but like all articles in the dried fruit line, prunes are not in strong demand. Of the situation in the future market the New York Journal of Commerce says:

"There is reported to be a more urgent desire on the part of coast packers to secure orders for the future California prunes, which finds expression in quotations that are a quarter to half a cent lower than prices named heretofore on the new crop. These prices are said to be entirely speculative, and there is a suspicion that they are being put out more for the purpose of influencing growers than in the hope of getting business in Eastern markets at this time. From some quarters 1908 Santa Claras are offered on a 3 1/4c f. o. b. bag basis in 40s and 90s, inclusive but there seems to be but one or two sellers at that price, 3 1/4c basis representing the minimum price in most cases, while a number of packers are not inclined to book orders on anything less than a 4c f. o. b. bag basis. As 30s and larger sizes promise to be extremely scarce on this crop, they are not being offered, so far as can be learned. Outside prunes are quoted in some instances on a 3 1/4c f. o. b. bag basis, but even that figure does not seem to appeal to buyers.
