stores whose advertisements are most convincing.

This means that in the coming year there is sure to be a re-alignment of local stores and business enterprises; and that the most aggressive advertisers are to forge to the front. This was always true, measurably. This year it will be positively true.

The local merchants who are planning their advertising campaigns for the year are also fixing, in a large measure, the places their stores are to occupy at the end of the year in the mercantile procession. So that 1908 is to be the year of opportunity for all merchants. For the big merchant, it will be an opportunity to use his resources and experience in advertising more fully and more liberally than in any previous year. For the small merchant, it will be an opportunity to display nerve and courage and, by advertising "more than he can afford," to forge ahead of the immediate competitors and to get in to company of the big fellows.

### MOTOR SPEEDING.

Considerable comment has been made lately by prominent citizens relative to automobile regulations and their observance.

Last week the Chronicle published a communication from District Attorney F. W. Wilson of The Dalles which gave in full the laws which govern the running of automobiles within the city limits and also in the country districts.

### THE FIRST REQUIREMENT DEALS WITH THE FRONT AND BACK LIGHTS, and says:

"Any automobile, motor vehicle or motor cycle when driven on any road or street MUST BE PROVIDED with at least one light showing red in the rear, and the license or certificate number shall be painted in plain figures across such white glass in said lamp."

The law also states that THE "MUFFLER" MUST NOT BE CUT OUT WITHIN THE LIMITS OF ANY CITY.

Drivers of automobiles must take every precaution for the prevention of accidents due to frightening of horses and are required to stop their machine should the rider or driver signal and not proceed forward UNTIL THE ANIMALS ARE UNDER THE CONTROL OF THEIR RIDER OR DRIVER.

The rate of speed within the limits of a city is not to exceed eight miles an hour and in the country must slow down to eight miles an hour within 300 feet of a vehicle drawn by horses.

A speed of one mile in 15 minutes must not be exceeded within the city when approaching crossings when persons are upon same.

### RACING A MACHINE ON ANY OF THE STREETS OR PARKWAYS

### OF THE CITY IS STRICTLY FORBIDDEN.

For any violation of the above laws there is fixed a penalty of not more than \$25 for the first offense; not more than \$50 for the second offense, and not more than \$100 for the third or any subsequent offense. These laws are explicit and cannot be misunderstood.

There are laws governing the rate at which a horse shall be rode or driven through the streets and they are observed to the letter.

Automobile drivers should study and become perfectly familiar with the laws under which they operate, as ignorance of law excuses no one.

There can be no doubt that the citizens of our city are proud of the fact that they can boast of so many of the best cars made but at the same time they ask THAT THE AUTOMOBILISTS OBSERVE THE LAWS OF THE STATE WHICH are placed in force for the protection of pedestrians and the drivers of horses.

As yet there have been no serious accidents but that is not saying that there will never be for if due precautions are not taken some innocent person is bound to suffer.

The Journal has it on reliable authority that the requirements of the laws regulating automobile driving must be complied with or the proper officials will take steps for their immediate enforcement.
