Cooperstown, N. Y., July 22.—Bishop Henry Codman Potter, of the Episcopal diocese of New York, died here last night. Death followed an illness of several weeks, which began with stomach trouble and developed complications. For the past week the bishop had appeared to gain, but he suffered a relapse yesterday, and last night all hope of recovery was abandoned.

NOTES FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF OREGON
University of Oregon, Eugene, July 22.—Mr. George N. Anderson, a former student here who has been in the Philippines during the past three years, has just given to the university museum a Negrito bow and full set of arrows, from the sharp barbed man-hunting arrow to the long four-pronged bamboo tippe, one used for birds. A half dozen other types of arrows are represented, including those used for hunting deer, wild boar and fish. The Negritos are a race of dwarfs inhabiting a large part of the Philippine Archipelago. Several of them were on exhibition at the Lewis & Clark fair.

A very fine clock has just been placed in the university library, a gift from the senior class of 1908. The clock stands a trifle over six feet in height and is enclosed in a handsome oak case, stained to match the woodwork of the library. It has been placed in the general reading room, and will add much to the convenience of students. The purchasing committee consisted of James Cuning of Baker City, president of the class; Miss Miriam Van Waters and Miss Jessie Chase, of Portland, and Oscar Furuset, of Eugene.
