BIG HAUL MADE BY ROBBERS

(United Press Leased Wire.) Reno, Nev., July 22.—The state police are today watching every station on the main line of the Southern Pacific in the northern part of this state on the lookout for two bandits who held up the stage coach between Likely and Alturas, Modoc county, Cal. The men held up the stage late Monday night about five miles from Likely and secured a Wells Fargo strong box containing \$28,000.

The bandits evidently knew of the box for they stopped the stage and ordered the Wells Fargo agent, who sat on the seat with the driver, to throw down the box. They then ordered the driver to whip up his horses and move on. None of the passengers knew of the hold-up, so quickly was it accomplished. The strong box contained the money for the payroll of the Nevada-California-Oregon railway and the payrolls of several stock camps. Word of the robbery was brought to this city last night.

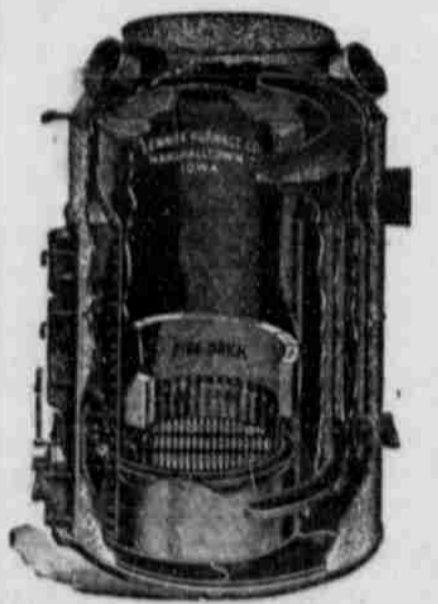
