# BIG ROLL FOR THE U. OF O.

University of Oregon, Eugene, Or., July 22.—The freshman class entering the University of Oregon this fall will be by far the largest in its history. Every indication points to a freshman registration of 250, and a total enrollment of nearly 600 students, not including the departments of law and medicine. Last year one-fourth of all the high school graduates of Oregon entered the University of Oregon, and there is every reason to believe that an even greater percentage will enter this fall, through the number of graduates is nearly a half larger than last year. Another source that will help swell the number very materially is the large number of Eastern people coming into the state. The registrar's office receives many letters each week asking if credits from Eastern high schools will be accepted. The demand for catalogues has been unprecedented, and unless all signs fall next year's enrollment will be a record breaker.
