A FEW WORDS ABOUT LOYALTY.

If he pays you wages that supply your bread and butter, work for him; speak well of him; stand by him and stand by the institution he represents. If not to a pinch AN OUNCE OF LOYALTY is worth a pound of cleverness. If you must vilify, condemn and eternally deride, why, resign your position, and when you are outside, damn to your heart's content. But as long as you are a part of the institution do not condemn it. If you do, you are loosening the tendrils that hold you to the institution, and the first high wind that comes along, you will be uprooted and blown away, and probably you will never know why.'

IMPROVING BAY CITY HARBOR.

Uncle Sam is making many improvements in San Francisco and vicinity in line with the more pronounced recognition that has lately been accorded to the Pacific Coast and the more general realization of the part the western border of the United States, fronting the Pacific ocean, is playing and will play in commercial activities.

Data given to the California Promotion committee by the federal officials show the appropriations secured by the California delegation in congress are being spent. The immigration station, under the control of the immigration service of

the Department of Commerce and Labor, is nearly completed. In the construction of it advantage has been taken of the experience gained in building and equipping the Ellis Island and other stations, and the defects discovered there will be avoided and eliminated. Occupying about ten acres of land, the station is situated in a protected cove on Angel Island in San Francisco Bay, removed but a few miles from the city. The wharf leads out to 25 feet of water at low tide and was built at a cost of \$200,000. An appropriation of \$125,000 provided for two vessels for the use of the service one for ferry service between the island and the mainland and the other as an auxiliary boat for the use of the boarding officers in meeting incoming vessels. The facilities of the station include a power house for pumping fresh and salt water, generating electricity and running the steam laundry. The administration building, furnished with every modern convenience in addition to the general offices, contains kitchens, dining rooms, etc., for feeding employees and detained immigrants, and there is a large hospital equipped with all the requirements of advanced surgical and medical science. Officers' quarters, an artesian water supply, gardens, roads, walls, fences, fire-fighting machinery, etc., are provided for in an appropriation by congress of \$50,000.

THE DES MOINES CITY CHARTER.

Des Moines, Iowa, has a system of expert commission government, conducted by five councilmen, one of whom is the mayor. The city is going ahead along the lines of business and improvement, and is growing in population and wealth. John MacVickar, formerly a mayor of Des Moines, spoke at the Commercial Club, giving facts of interest about Des Moines' government.

Years ago Des Moines was one of the most sleepy towns in the middle west. Although the capital of Iowa, one of the greatest states in the Union, the town had but 20,000 inhabitants in 1855, and was the traction center of a mule car line operated by Dr. Turner. The cars were being in a class among other comic opera jokes.

Not until about 1880 did the city get a first class hotel. Then with electric cars, some street paving of modern type, and a few boomers to open new additions, inspire the newspapers and agitate better city government. Des Moines began growing and improving. It has kept up a fairly steady rate of growth since that time.

Some years ago the non-partisan movement struck Des Moines and its city government began to improve. The city has never let go its advantage in this respect and although a strong Republican city it has kept the bugaboo of non-partisan city gov-

ernment before the eyes of the politicians. Ultimately the vote forced the adoption of the initiative and referendum, and the recall, and have now completely remodeled the city government.

'The Des Moines method of city government is a combination of several systems,' Mr. McVickar said. 'It embraces some parts of the plan of government by board of control, by which all Iowa state institutions are successfully managed. There are also some features of the Galveston commission included. The initiative, referendum and recall are embodied in the plan.

'There are five men in the city council, and the mayor is one of civil service rules are in effect. The five councilmen, with the mayor, devote their entire time to managing the city government.

'There are five departments and one of the councilmen is at the head of each department. The mayor is superintendent of the department of public welfare. A councilman heads each of the following departments: Accounting and finance; police, fire and health department; department of parks and public property; department of streets and public improvements.

'All of these heads of departments, or councilmen, are supposed to be experts in the lines of work they represent. They are nominated for their fitness to handle their departments. They appoint and direct their subordinates, and are responsible for the results obtained in their various departments.'

SALEM NEWS OF THE WATER FRONT

Some very effective work is now being done in the Willamette river a few miles north of this city on what is called 'The Five Islands,' by the dipper dredge, 'Mathaloma.' Captain J. N. Graham in charge. The islands on which the big digger is operating, have been given more or less trouble every low water season, and at times the river boats had hard work getting through them, and have been the means of cutting down the transportation on the river to less every year. Mr. J. Reed is in charge of the engineering work and thoroughly understand bank rip-rapping and repairing channels which are in shallow for navigation.
