When the chauffeur saw the buggy he attempted to turn out of the way, but the wheels would not grip the road, and the machine grazed the wheels of the buggy.

The machine was at once stopped, and the governor offered to take Mrs. Ramsden to her home in the car. She said, however, that she could drive the buggy home. She thought her condition was not serious, but this morning she is confined to her bed, and is suffering considerable pain. Governor Chamberlain said this morning that he regretted very much that the accident had happened, and that he thought no one was to blame. He said that he would visit Mrs. Ramsden this afternoon at her home near the Greer farm, and see how she was getting along.

the fire, although approximately 500 acres have been swept over.

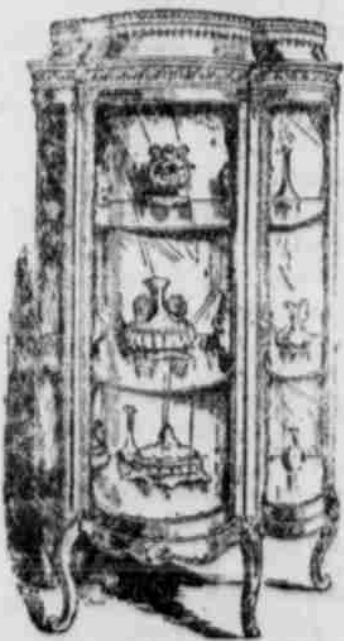
Fire is also reported in the timber near Topsy grade on the old Ager stage road, and rangers have been sent there.

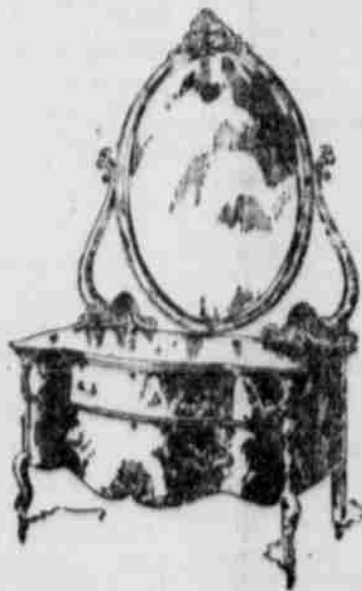

HARRIMAN GETS CONTROL OF OCEAN TO OCEAN ROAD

New York, July 29.—That an agreement has been reached between George Gould and E. W. Harriman, by which Harriman has at last secured control of railroad reaching from ocean to ocean is the rumor that is current today. Following the return yesterday of George Gould from Europe.

According to the story here, Gould will remain president of his road, but their policies will be directed by Harriman. The agreement will give the Gould roads money for necessary improvements, and will give Harriman joint use of the Missouri Pacific and the Western Pacific, which Gould is now building.

The Erie road will have a half interest in either by direct ownership or trackage rights over the Wheeling and Lake Erie and the Wabash-Pittsburg terminal. This will let the Erie into Pittsburg.

It is understood here that Harriman has abandoned all plan for the Harriman holding company, which was to have taken over the investments of the Union Pacific.
