UNABATED ACTIVITY MARKS RAILROAD EXTENSION PROGRESS THROUGHOUT CALIFORNIA.

Of especial moment is the application for franchises, and the assurance of prompt prosecution of the work, for the electrification of the Alameda suburban service in connection with the ferry to San Francisco, a work that will involve the expenditure of over two million dollars.

Almost at San Francisco's gates is the new trans-continental railroad, which has now reached San Leandro, Alameda county. That little known county of Modoc, one of immense productive potentiality, will be brought within better reach of markets for its products through the connection of its county seat, Alturas, with the main line.

STEEL CORPORATION PROTECTS EMPLOYEES

Pittsburg, Aug. 3.—"No superintendent, foreman, boss or clerk shall be permitted to solicit money or make collections from workmen for any church, society or association," is the notice posted by the United States steel corporation to protect employees from the machinations of bosses, who have been bleeding them for political purposes.

Another rule prohibits employees from influencing other employees from dealing in products of any other company. This is to prevent bosses from forcing the men to buy supplies at places in which the bosses are interested.

The South Salem Fairmount club took the Albany Alco club into a losing camp yesterday afternoon on the league grounds with a score of six to two, and notwithstanding several wild throws over bases, the contest was fast and interesting.

The Alco club scored the first run in the first inning when Mason hit to Miller who made slow work of it, and let the runner lay safe. Dooly then hit to Dae, and an error of Holman let Mason to third, who came home on a wild throw of Rhodes over Humphrey's head at third.

The third canto saw a score for Shipp's Fairmounts. Cary walked and Coleman, the real mainstay of the home aggregation, hit through first base, the ball bounding past the vitting right fielder, letting Cary score.

Albany again put the score off balance in the fourth inning. Dooly got a single and was placed on second by a hit by Richmond followed by Hockenyo who hit safe scoring Dooly which was the last visitor to cross the home plate during the remainder of the game.

The Fairmount club took a hitting streak on in the last of the fourth and chased up two runs in short order. Rhodes made a two-sack hit, followed by Arnold, who got a little single and, due to some extremely childish playing on the part of the right fielder for the visitors who let the ball roll unmolesated through his hands, Arnold took third and afterward came home on a high throw by the Albany catcher over the last sack, Rhodes also scoring. Roy Phillips walloped out a two-base hit in this inning also. This unlucky piece of playing practically busted the game to pieces, as the local lads found Pitcher Stevens hard during the remainder of the contest.

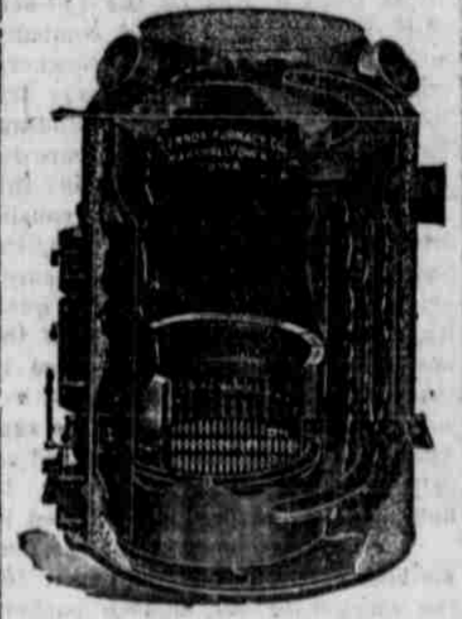
