It is thought that the articles signed through their managers for a fight in San Francisco on Labor Day will be revised.

The weight, 123 pounds before the fight, which is to be pulled off in the afternoon, will stand, but the men will have to choose a referee. Jeffries, who was originally selected, has refused to enter.

The Englishman will start in training at Billy Shannon's place in San Rafael not later than Wednesday of this week.
