Output of Lumber, Lath and
In 1907 the output of lumber in the United States amounted to 40,256,000,000 feet, board measure. In 1906 the output totaled 37,551,000,000 feet. Thus 1907 scored a gain of 2,705,000,000 feet, or 7.2 per cent, over 1906. For lath and shingles the total production was 3,364,000,000 and 11,950,000,000 respectively in 1907, as against 3,813,000,000 and 11,358,000,000, respectively in 1906, a decrease of 149,000,000 or 3.9 per cent in lath and an increase of 92,000,000 or eight-tenths of 1 per cent in shingles. The number of mills reporting in 1907 was 28,850, while in 1906 the cut of 22,398 mills was covered. In 1909 the cut amounted to 35,084,000,000 feet, and in 1894 and 1905 the output amounted to 34,135,000,000 feet and 30,503,000,000 feet, respectively. According to the Bureau of the Census, the figures for 1904 were compiled at the quinquennial census of manufactures of 1905, which was limited to merchant mills, thus excluding small neighborhood mills and those engaged exclusively in local custom sawing, which probably accounts for the fact that the total cut for that year was smaller than in 1900, 1906 or 1907. The figures for 1905, while doubtless covering the cut of most of the large mills of the country, manifestly fall short giving complete figures for that year. In order, however, that the comparison of the annual cut might be given as wide a scope as possible, these figures for 1904 and 1905 are presented, as they constitute the most complete record available for these years.

YOUNG LAWYERS LOCATE IN SALEM

Both men were admitted of the bar in the state of

Mr. Robinson comes from Winchester, Va., where his father has one of the largest commercial orchards in the Shenandoah valley. He has been closely connected with the business himself, and intends to continue so in addition to practicing law.

Mr. Benson's home was at Rockville, Md. After graduating in law, he became an associate editor on the staff of the Michie law publishing company of Charlottesville, Va., whence he came here. While engaged in law writing, he wrote the title "Wills" in both the Tennessee and New Jersey encyclopaedias and "Arbitration and Award" in the United States Encyclopedia and a number of other subjects. While at college, he took an active part in literary society work and was one of the speakers at the 118th anniversary celebration of the Graham-Lee society, in his senior year.

These young men come to Salem with the best recommendations and are confident that they have come to a superior country. They hope to work up a practice rapidly as a number of the oldest lawyers are giving them the glad hand in a way that conveys assurance to the newcomers.
