THE OSTRICH.

It pays to do big things. A leghorn hen industriously lays 240 eggs in the year, worth 25 or 30 cents a dozen. But an ostrich in one year produces 30 eggs, each of which is 30 times as large as a hen's egg, and worth perhaps ten thousand times as much if it hatches, and five hundred times as much if it doesn't hatch. More than one-fourth of all the ostrich eggs produce ostriches which grow to maturity, while 90 per cent of the chicken eggs hatch. In other words, big, broad plans will carry you farther along the road to success, even if some fail, than if will avail you if you be a potterer. Ostrich feathers are worth \$250 per pound; hen's feathers bring 10 cents if you can sell them. An adult ostrich is worth from fifteen hundred to five thousand dollars, or more. A hen who has done her duty brings 50 cents for a stew. Moral: Let us all be ostriches.

GENERAL WEATHER SUMMARY

The mean temperatures during the week were slightly above normal, caused almost entirely by the afternoon temperatures being unusually high. The night temperatures, as a rule, were normal except in a few of the southwestern counties, where they were slightly below normal. The 29th, 30th and 31st were very warm days and maximum temperatures of 100 degrees or higher were common everywhere in the valleys east of the Cascade mountains. In the western counties, except near the coast, the maximum temperatures on those days ranged between 86 degrees and 98 degrees. The opening and closing days of the week were cooler and more favorable. Attending the hot weather were strong northerly winds varying in direction from northwest to north and northeast according to the trend of the valleys in which they were experienced. No rain has fallen during the week and the period without rain has now lasted 18 days in most counties and in some localities much longer. In consequence of the dry weather brush and forest fires have started in a number of places and the atmosphere became slightly smoky on the 28th and the smokiness has increased and spread until the close of the week when it was noticeable in nearly all districts.
