**Prosperity for All.**

"We all want prosperity, and what more, we want prosperity for all. I urge our party, therefore, to be intelligently and generously constructive, not merely obstructive; not the Republican party, nor the Democratic party, like the Democratic party. The Republican platform says nothing and means nothing. It is a platform of statistical invention and political evasions. It is obviously the product of a party whose sole purpose is to stand pat, and whose sole desire is to stand pat. The Democratic platform contains some good and original things, but, as has been said, the original things are not good and the good things are not original."
