# RAILROAD EMPLOYEES OPPOSE LEGISLATION

Chicago, Aug. 8.—A coalition of railroad employees of all the Western roads, for the purpose of assisting their employers in fighting hostile legislation by the state and national authorities, was announced by W. H. Thomas, of Kansas City, a passenger conductor on the Chicago, Rock Island & Pacific railway, who is in this city today in the interest of the new movement.

The plan will be to organize all the railway protective associations of the various states into a central body, with sufficient political influence to be a power in the state legislatures. By this means laws inimical to the railroads can be combated, and possibly averted, says Thomas.

Thomas says the movement has spread spontaneously from the employees, who fear that drastic legislation against the railroads will eventually result in reduction in their wages.
