

## CAPITAL IS TO HAVE A MODERN GARAGE

Salem is now to have one of the most up-to-date garages between San Francisco and Seattle which is to be erected on the southeast corner of Commercial and Center streets, the property having been purchased by Jack Peterson a capitalist well known in both this city and Portland.

The proposed structure, built of brick, will be two stories high, with a roomy basement and the dimensions are 85x162 feet. All modern machines for repairing purposes will be installed in the building for "doctoring" up outside autos as well as those owned by the garage for hire. Six experienced machinists will be employed by the automobile people, some of whom are residents of Salem.
