### THE CONGRESS OF NATIONS.

Twenty-eight Languages Spoken in the Circus Dressing Tents.

No less than 15 interpreters are employed to keep the several hundred performers of the Barnum and Bailey circus on a basis of intelligent communication. For a stranger to look through the dressing tents would be like a trip through Europe. He would hear twenty-eight languages spoken and meet with nearly every phase of human life. It is impossible to convey any adequate idea of the magnitude of the event and the Bailey circus this year. It is the old-time circus man who has been for years with the organization. It never ceases to be a source of wonder how such a wonderful institution can cover the amount of territory it does, performing twice daily, handling millions of people each season, and each day building a city of tents in the morning and tearing it down at night, and taking it away on the great trains, ready for the next day's stand. It is the wonderful system of the late James A. Bailey that has made it possible to thus handle the greatest traveling enterprise in the world. And it is the wonderful policy of the greatest showman of all time, P. T. Barnum, living today in the present management, that has only fixed this show in the lead of others in the world in size and worth. ### DEVELOPMENT WORK ALL OVER OREGON.

Vigorous protests were entered by the commercial interests of Oregon and the Oregon State Dairy association, against the adoption by the Pure Food Conference at Mackinac Island, Michigan, of a Standard for evaporated milk requiring 28 per cent solids. Oregon's milk is rich in butterfat, owing to our climatic conditions, but abundant pasture means less solids than in milk from cows fed eight months in the year. Oregon dairymen and condensers insist that solids should be such as result from the use of whole milk in their product.

E. H. Harriman, the greatest individuality in the railroad world, is enjoying with his family the glories of Oregon's August climate at Pelican Lodge, near Klamath Lake. Their stay will cover several weeks. Vice-Presidents Julius Kruttschnitt and E. E. Calvin accompanied Mr. Harriman to Oregon, but during his vacation they will be busy inspecting their roads throughout the state.

Three Oregon athletes won honors at the Olympic games in London—no other state in the Union made such a showing. The boys will be royally entertained in Portland when they return early in September. Both athletic and commercial bodies are uniting in the arrangements.

The different fair associations of Oregon are co-operating for a splendid display of products and great showing of livestock at the fall show in Salem, with the best races ever held in the state. All this has its part in the development of the state, by creating such an interest in livestock production as will mean an ample supply for the support of the great packing plants now under construction in Portland.
