(United Press Leased Wire.) Rome, Italy, Aug. 13.—A threatened mutiny in the Palatine Guard, the pope's soldiers, is said to have led Pope Pius today to order that the guard be disbanded.

WICKERSHAM ELECTED ALASKA COMMISSIONER

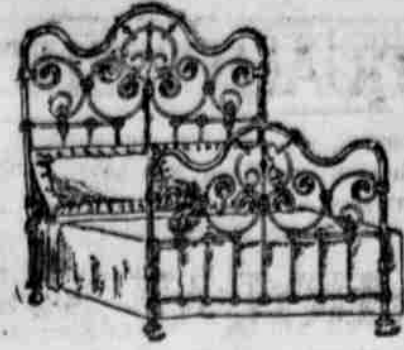
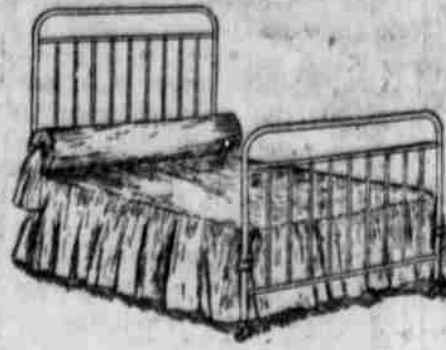

The leaders of the Young Turk party are elated over their victory, and make no secret of their desire that Abdul Hamid II. abdicate the throne. They want Yussuf Izzeddin, second in line for the Turkish throne, proclaimed emperor.

Izzeddin barely escaped death at the hands of assassins lately, and the care with which the news was suppressed has led to the belief that the supporters of Abdul Hamid are responsible for the plot.

Yussuf believes that the grant of the constitution was merely an expedient by which Abdul Hamid hoped to gain time and that, as soon as he considers himself strong enough, it will be withdrawn. The openness with which he has expressed his opinions has brought all the radicals under his banner, and several demonstrations have been made in his favor.

London, Aug. 13.—An official of the foreign office today said, in discussing the situation in Turkey in connection with the meetings of King Edward with Emperor William and Franz Josef of Austria, that the powers have decided not to interfere in Turkish affairs at present.

Washington, Aug. 13.—Broken-hearted over his political downfall, Mehmed Alibey, Syrian, today sulks in the upper room of the little red brick house that was, until yesterday, the legation of the Ottoman empire.

Mundji Bey, his successor, who was until yesterday, consul-general of Turkey at New York, strolls the hotel corridors, explaining to all comers that the change is simply the result of the new regime.
