

END-IN-HAND WITH DEATH

Reach the Limit of Hazard in New Circus Thriller.

The latest devilish device for generating thrills and giving shocks to the nervous system is an act known as "Autos That Pass in the Air," being exploited this season by the Barnum and Bailey Greatest Show on Earth. The act is performed by mere girls, who have broken all previous records of reckless and daring undertakings.

The feat is not a matter for word painting. From the release of the cars at the top of the incline to their safe landing just four seconds elapse, but it is a moment of such intense excitement and suspense to spectators that they are held rigid and breatheless in their seats. At the moment the cars are spanning the gap, one describing a perfect circle with the other as its axis, there is a pause of great excitement that strains the eyes almost to the snapping point. It seems that the two young women must certainly be dashed to death. Then, as the landing is made perfectly safely, the audience shows relief by a storm of applause. There is not a thrill left in all the throats of the past. They lose their fear of fascination in the presence of this game with death.

The announcement of the coming of the Barnum and Bailey Greatest Show on Earth never before carried so much significance that it does this year. In addition to the novelty and sensation of its performance there is the return of the great parade feature, which this circus has omitted for the past four years. But it was never the intention to abandon the parade idea. It was left out of the show's exhibitions merely because of the lack of novelties. Rather than repeat itself the feature was cut out of the time being and agents were sent to every quarter of the earth in search of novelty, and designers, artists and inventors were set to work. The four years' labors of these agents is the magnificent parade which this season is presented for the admiration of America.

And this free pageant is a veritable world's exposition, a compilation of the wonders of the universe and a complete congress of nations and tribes. In the way of physical equipment it has costumes of French manufacture, draperies and tapestry from the Orient, vehicles of barbaric make and fantastic in design and elaborate chariots, floats and tableaux of hammered brass and burnished gold made in Paris.

OREGON WOOL BRINGS BETTER PRICE IN MONTANA

(East Oregonian.) A dispatch from Baker, Mont., a new station on the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul railroad, in the eastern part of the state, says that the most which this wool clip was short had were held at that place last Friday and Saturday, when over 1,000,000 pounds of wool sold at an average of 18 cents, the highest average of the entire northwest for the season. About one-half of the sheep from which this wool clip was shorn had been shipped to Forsythe and other Montana ranges this season, and were shorn there, making practically half of the 1,000,000 pounds sold, Oregon wool.

The same grade of wool was sold in eastern Oregon this spring and summer from 11 to 13 cents, or from 5 to 7 cents lower than the Montana prices. The Oregon sheep were not washed before being shorn, but had all of the Oregon sand in their wool, thus dispelling the claim that the higher prices in Montana are the result of cleaner and lighter fleeces.
