 Pensacola, Fla., Aug. 14.—The sheriff and hundreds of armed citizens are scouring the country today searching for George Coombs, a negro, who is charged with having attacked Mrs. Ed. Mocklair, a young woman, at her home four miles from this city, last night. Mrs. Mocklair is reported to be in a serious condition. There is little doubt but that an attempt will be made to lynch the negro if he is captured.

 Marienbad, Austria, Aug. 14.—King Edward is today leading the "simple life," so far as he is able. He is trying to recuperate his health, and lives every hour according to the prescription of physicians.

The King rises early in the morning, takes a stroll about the grounds of the resort and eats his meals at stipulated hours. He eats only what is prescribed by the doctors, and takes a certain amount of mineral water. He has been compelled to cut down his smoking to a minimum.

There has been such a rush to see the King that the mayor has posted an appeal to the people to allow the visiting monarch the privacy of an individual. Twenty Austrian police are on guard at the King's apartments night and day.

GARUSO IS DESERTED BY SPOUSE

PACIFIC FLEET PREPARES FOR CRUISE

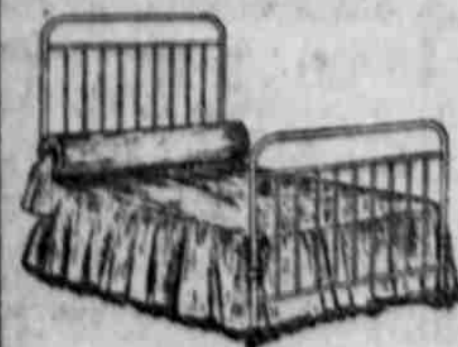

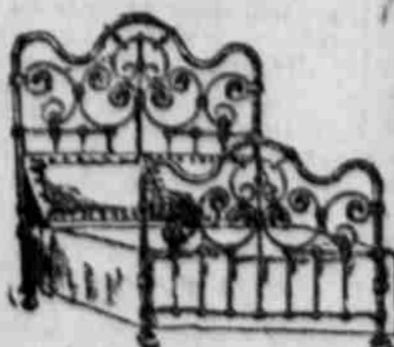
BURNED TO DEATH IN ROOMING HOUSE
