

ORGANIZE WOOL STORAGE SYSTEM

(Baker City Democrat.)
An important meeting of sheep men is to be held in Salt Lake August 25th, at which a national storage movement is to be started for the purpose of putting an end to the movement in the wool market, which the sheep men say, takes place every spring, about shearing time, and usually results in heavy loss by the sheep men of the west, and a proportionate profit to the buyers, whom the maneuvering to keep down prices at the time the wool is passing from the control of the producers, is credited.
The call has been issued by Secretary Walker of the National Woolgrowers' association, whose headquarters are at Cheyenne, Wyoming, stating that the executive committee of the organization would meet in Salt Lake on August 25th. Many representatives from surrounding states will also be in attendance at the meeting.
The movement for a national storage system is the outcome of the success which the Utah sheepmen met with this spring, they having organized and stored their wool instead of selling it at the low prices offered by the buyers. As a result the price was raised from 8 to 12-1-2 cents.

The dredge "Alliance" is ready to begin work at Coos Bay.
The Eugene Divinity school is drawing many pupils.
Egon-Idaho Development congress, when they meet August 24.
The rain slightly interfered with harvesting in Umatilla county.
Examinations for teachers' diplomas are being held at Albany.
Corvallis is planning an All-Benton School Fair for September 3, 4 and 5.
David Eccles, Utah capitalist, is planning to finance a \$1,500,000 irrigation project at La Grande.
The Rogue River Water company has offered to sell its plant to Grants Pass for \$94,000.

CHOLERA SPREADING
-IN ST. PETERSBURG

St. Petersburg, Aug. 14.—The epidemic of cholera is spreading, the latest death occurring in a town in Tula province, near the estate of Count Tolstol. Reports up to date show that Tzaritzin, where the disease has been the most severe, 150 persons have died within the last few days.

PIONEER NICHOLAS DAY ANSWERS LAST CALL

(Roseburg Review.)
Death Tuesday evening, August 11, 1908, summoned another of Douglas county's prominent and honored pioneers, in the person of Nicholas T. Day, who passed away at the home of Jesse T. Thompson, at Coles valley. Mr. Day was nearly 88 years of age. About six months ago his health began to fail rapidly and during the past week his condition was such that death was expected at any hour.
The funeral will be held from the Methodist Episcopal church in this city tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock with services conducted by Rev. J. K. Hawkins. Interment will occur in Masonic cemetery beside the grave of Mr. Day's wife, who died in 1897.
Mr. Day was born in Taxewell county, Virginia, October 26, 1820. At the age of 21 he emigrated to Wisconsin and engaged in lead mining. While in that state he also voted for its admission in to the Union. In 1850 Mr. Day journeyed across the plains into Oregon, stopping first at The Dalles, where he was employed by the government for two months building the historic old log fort, which served as a means of defense against Indian attacks. Mr. Day spent the winter of 1850 in Yamhill county, and in the following March, in company with General Palmer and 21 other men, he went to the mines at Yreka, Calif. In 1852 Mr. Day returned to Oregon, settling at the mouth of the Calapooia river, 10 miles west of Oakland, where he remained continuously up to the time his health began to fail.

DISAPPEAR ENROUTE TO ASHLAND

Ephriam Hedberg's sudden disappearance while enroute from Wisconsin to Ashland, Ore., is one of the greatest mysteries ever brought to the attention of the public.
On the night of August 5 he left his little daughter on the train at Umatilla and stepped off to get a lunch at the depot lunch counter and has never been seen since. He carried drafts on the Cumberland State Bank of Wisconsin, one for \$90 and one for \$100. It is feared that he fell a victim to robbery and murder.
Ephriam Hedberg was 63 years old, 5 feet 6 inches tall, and weighed about 135 pounds. He had dark hair, sandy mustache, and chin whiskers. A light gray coat and vest were his distinguishing garments.
His nephew, G. H. Hedberg, a Southern Pacific lineman of Ashland, arrived in the city today to make inquiry concerning his uncle, but as he looks into the matter the mystery deepens and there is absolutely no clue to the old gentleman's whereabouts.
All the banks in the country have been notified of the disappearance of the drafts and it will be impossible to cash them if the old man has been murdered.
