er. When these eels fight they may lacerate each other terribly with their cruel teeth, and the old eel was apparently intent on fighting now. So they drove the new eel into one section of the tank by itself, and put down a wire screen between that section and the other. Later they will raise the screen and let the giant eels get together again, and after a time when they get used to one another, they are likely to dwell together in amity.

In the same shipment was a young green moray, about three feet in length, one of a size never before seen here. There were in the lot altogether upward of 250 odd and beautiful fishes representing 24 varieties and including princess rock fish, surgeon fish, yellow grunt, white grunts, coneys, lady fish, sergeant majors, bream, gray snappers, hinds, cowfish, trunkfish, green parrot fish, squirrel fish, mud parrots, red finned parrots and tiger rockfish. —New York Sun.

The Beauties of Mount Shasta.

Not long after seeing some very good "castle rocks" somewhere, Alberta, suddenly pressed both hands over her heart, exclaimed, "Oh, see that!" I looked up between the rich evergreens outlining the top of the valley, and there was the whole sky filled with a great white gleam too sparkling for clouds. We soon distinguished its outlines and knew it must be Shasta. This really was a "peak," with a point and edges and sharp buttresses, not a mold of ice-cream rounded off with a spoon.

It showed itself several times, at the turns and gaps of the canyon, and since we have got over the divide and into the head valley it has been with us almost constantly for hours.

Well, that is what Shasta has been doing for us until after an extraordinary time, interest has become fatigued, as it does in an art gallery, and I have turned to write about the mountain. And I had come to scoff! Yesterday I said: "From the rest of the trip I am not expecting much to compare with what we have had. There will be nothing but mountains. Now mountains are good things perhaps the best things, but the world is full of them. We have our own at home as beautiful as any, although, of course, not as large as some. But size makes very little difference; the question is one mainly of shape and atmospheric effect. But at home we have no Grand canyon and no Yosemite; they are unique; the rest of the trip can have nothing to compare with them." —Henry Holt in Putnam's.

Alaska's Great Stores of Coal.

As far back as 1902 the Geological Survey began a systematic study of Alaska coal fields, commencing with a geologic reconnaissance of the low grade bituminous and lignite coals of the Yukon region. In 1902, 1903, 1904 and 1905 investigations were made of the Nenana fields near Fairbanks. In 1903 work was begun on the coal fields of the Controller bay region, and in 1905 the Matanuska field was studied in geologic detail. In these two fields there are 100 square miles of lands underlain by workable coals containing anthracite and bituminous fuels of the highest grade. In 1902 the Herendeen bay bituminous coal region was studied by survey geologists. In 1903 coal investigations were made of the southeastern Alaska coal fields, which have not, however, proved of economic importance. In 1904 the geologic study of the Cape L'Esperance coal region was commenced. This is a bituminous coal field containing soft coal that ranges from low to high grade, and at present its boundaries are only partially known. In 1904 survey work was commenced in the large lignite fields of the Kenai peninsula.

The work of the geological survey is thus being carried out along definite lines of determining the coal resources of Alaska, not only with relation to local consumption, but with reference to their effect upon the total coal reserve of the country. The work is of special importance and the showing highly satisfactory because of the comparative lack of large developed coal supplies on the Pacific coast of the United States proper.

The Alaska coal fields, particularly those carrying a high-grade fuel, like the Controller bay and the Matanuska fields, are destined to play an important part in the advancement of industry on the entire Pacific seaboard of the North American continent.

The minable coal in the ground in Alaska has not yet been definitely estimated, and whatever estimates are made, for some years to come, will doubtless be subject to wide expansion as further geological explorations are carried forward; but it is proper to say that the coal resources of the territory are very great, and that they will be figured in hundreds of millions, and even billions, of tons.

Tropical Fish in New York's Aquarium.

The two great green morays that have long been an attraction at the Aquarium have in the tank with them now a new-comer of the same species that arrived from Bermuda on July 10th. The newly arrived giant eel is fully as big as either of the two others, being five feet and something over in length; in color it is of the same dull olive green, but of a little deeper tint.

The big green morays here occupy two tanks thrown into one, with a wide arch between. When the new moray was put into the tank preparations were made to set it apart there if the old morays should resent its presence, and it was soon necessary to separate it. The new moray had scarcely straightened itself out before one of the old eels came sliding silently alongside, with its head beside that of the new-comer.
