CLASSIFICATION OF

PRISONERS PLANNED

(United Press Leased Wire.) Sacramento , Cal., Aug. 19,-Warden Reilly of Folsom peltentiary, is working on a system of classification by which the prisoners detained there will be divided into three groups, composed respectively of first entirely apart.

By this means, Warden Reilly hopes to bring about a greater percentage of reformations, especially speech censuring congress for negamong first offenders. These are lecting banks,
