That the home city of the Emancipator should be the scene of a serious outbreak of bloody hostility is remarkable.

If this had occurred in one of the unreconstructed, uncivilized states of the south WE COULD IGNORE THE WHOLE PROPOSITION.

But at Springfield, Ill., we cannot.

Is a race war avoidable? Can the Anglo-Saxon race survive alongside the African?

The traits of the white race are that IT ASSIMILATES OR DESTROYS RACES IT COMES IN CONTACT WITH, LIKE THE INDIANS, ETC.

It can neither assimilate nor annihilate the black race.

UNION MAKES HALF MILLION GAIN

(East Oregonian.)
The La Grande Observer says of the Union county assessment for this year:

Union county's assessed valuation for 1908 is almost \$7,000,000, according to grand totals that have been compiled in the assessor's office this week from assessments in all the districts of the county.

There are several assessments in La Grande that have not been made for the reason that the property owners are out of the city. When they return, the assessment roll for the entire county will be complete. County is richer.

By a half million dollars the county technically speaking is richer than last year. There is, technically speaking, more than a half million dollars additional wealth in the county, because horses and household goods are assessed lower than last year. Then, too, there were fewer notes assessed this year than last. The only thing that is assessed higher this year is timber land. There is a large figure in timber land and this has in a measure helped to swell the total assessment figures.

The increase in valuation is largely for improved property. The deputy assessors found improvement rampant in all parts of the county and houses and buildings of all descriptions that last year were valued as ordinary property have this year improved to such an extent that the owners will be required to pay at first-class property rates.

It is seldom that the county's wealth has increased so much in one year as it has since the 1907 assessment.

General Weather Summary.

The temperature was nearly normal in the southwestern counties and slightly below normal elsewhere throughout the state. The coolest period was from the 12th until the 14th, and the warmest weather prevailed during the closing days of the week. The long drought was broken by showers which were general during the afternoon of the 12th and the forenoon of the 13th. The heaviest rain fell in the lower portion of the Willamette valley and amounted to nearly three-quarters of an inch. In the eastern and southern counties the rainfall was in most places very light and insufficient to lay the dust or to clear the atmosphere of smoke. The sunshine was nearly normal and no damaging high winds occurred.

OLD GOLCONDA MINE IS SOLD

(Baker City Herald.)

The old Golconda mine in this county has just been sold at sheriff's sale for claims amounting to \$20,000, which claims were held by hardware firms and supply houses. The property was at one time a great producer and the Golconda's richness was one of the props that held up the Sumpter boom for a long time. It was formerly managed by James A. Howard, now a member of the Oregon-Idaho Investment company of this city. In recent years Editor Jackson of the Portland Journal, became interested in the Golconda, and it is understood that he still retains much of the stock. Like most stock-selling propositions, this mine has had its ups and downs, and now closes its first epoch by selling under the hammer, and being bid in by creditors through their attorney, James Chincock of this city. O. D. Glover has been care taker of the mine for some time. It is understood here that the property is filled with water, and expensive machinery placed on the ground in prosperous days has been permitted to corrode to a certain extent. It has a water power right and some electrical machinery. Nothing is given out as to what the intentions are relative to putting the mine in working condition again.

CATTLE BUSINESS BEGINNING EARLY

(Pendleton Tribune.)

Although the flush of the cattle-shipping season is yet two weeks or more off, business in that line has been active for some time. It was estimated at the stockyards yesterday that over 1500 head of fat beefs have been shipped out of this city since the first of the month. The shipping season proper will begin with the first week of September, after which time shipments will be much larger than during the present month.

Thus far practically all shipments have been made to Seattle and Tacoma, Fry-Bruhn in the former and Carstine Bros. in the latter city being the chief buyers. Eight carloads of cattle were shipped to these companies yesterday from the local yards.

William G. Welch, brand inspector for this section of the state said yesterday that the larger portion of the cattle of Grant, Morrow, Wheeler and Umatilla counties were shipped from the local yards. The industry for practically the entire northeastern portion of the state centers in this city and constitutes no small factor in the business of the locality.

Another lot of cattle is expected to arrive today from the John Day district. This bunch of over 200 head is being brought in by Ben Calvin, the well-known cattleman of that district.

In addition to these, 3900 head were purchased in the Izze country by Nate Raines, who is buying for the Seattle firm. This lot will be brought in early in September.

The market price at present ranges from 2 1/2 of 3 cents per pound on foot for cows, and 3 1/2 to 3 3/4 cents for steers. This is considered about an average price. Inspector Welch said yesterday that it was about the same as was paid this time last year.

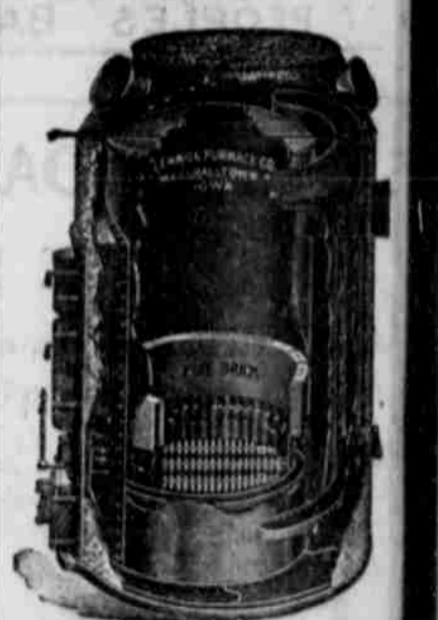
