WASHINGTON OBJECTS TO SHEEP DIPPING LAW

(Pendleton Tribune.)
Fresh trouble is brewing between the Washington and Oregon sheepmen over the law which requires all sheep brought into the state to be dipped. The range involved is the Wenara government reserve which has been a herder's storm center for several years.

Attorney H. C. Bryson of Walla Walla came down yesterday and filed the case for the Washington sheepmen, asking for a temporary injunction against the Oregon state sheep inspector to prevent his reserving the Washington sheep on the reserve dipped until the case shall be tried upon its merits before Judge Bean of the circuit court.

Mr. Bryson said yesterday that the Oregon law did not require the dipping of sound sheep after August 1; that the Washington sheep on the reserve had been duly inspected and found to be in good condition; that water was low on the reserve, and that he considered the case one of selfishness on the part of Oregon sheepmen.

Another Side to the Subject.
W. H. Lytle, however, puts the matter in a different light when the state sheep inspector shows up the law to the effect that all sheep must be dipped once a year and that the reason for dipping the Washington sheep at the present time is that the time was extended from August 1 to September 1.

At the proper time the Washington sheepmen were ordered to do their dipping and were preparing for it, but Forester Schmitz forbade it being done on the reserve. This delayed matters until the Oregon state inspector wrote to the head of the forestry office at Washington. The letter brought forth an immediate revocation of Schmitz's decree. The way being clear, therefore, Lytle proposes to go ahead with the dipping.

The law referred to by Mr. Bryson regarding the first of August as the limit, after which sheep need not be dipped, admits of an extension of the time in case it is necessary to do so. The action of Forester Schmitz, who has his office in Walla Walla, compelled the extension of the time. The intent of the law is to have the sheep dipped once each year for the sake of the health of all the flocks on the range. This policy was heartily approved of by the head office of the forest service in the letter written to the Oregon state inspector.

Judge Gilliland had not given his decision yesterday evening, but it is probable that he will find the Washington men entitled to the temporary restraining order until Judge Bean returns to hear the case.

BAKER HAY CROP IS NEARLY NORMAL
