Trained animal displays, in which all sorts of animals figure, will delight the children, and in diversity, novelty and freshness of the program will be found much to amuse and instruct all classes of patrons. The street parade will leave the grounds at 10 o'clock and cover the principal streets. It is over a mile in length and rich in
