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STATE FAIR NOTES

The greater Oregon state fair Sept. 14-19 will this year be the largest and best in the history of the northwest.

McElroy's band, consisting of 25 expert musicians, has been engaged to play every day during the week of September 14 to 19 at the Oregon state fair at Salem.

Eight counties of Oregon have signified their intention of providing large exhibits. The counties to participate are: Clatsop, Columbia, Clackamas, Marion, Linn, Lane, Benton, Multnomah and Yamhill.

College Maid, a guideless pacer, has been engaged as one of the many attractions. She has a record of 2:09 for a mile, without driver. Mr. Ervin, the trainer of the mare, says she will lower this mark if given a chance on Lone Oak track.

One of the features of the fair will be the herd of eight performing ponies, which is owned in Fresno, Cal. The ponies will be raced every day at the fair, with boy jockeys, the distance to be one-fourth of a mile. None of the Shetlands is more than 42 inches high. The ponies will be at the service of the children during the day and a ride will be one of the delights of the big fair for the youngsters.

W. H. Carlyle, who has been engaged as dean of the livestock judges at the greater Oregon state fair, is one of the most experienced judges in America, having served at the most important expositions. Among these are the Omaha exposition, the International Livestock show at Chicago, the Charleston exhibition, the Canadian National exposition at Toronto and the St. Louis world fair. Mr. Carlyle is dean of the Colorado state agricultural college.

FIGHT FOR IMPROVED CAR SERVICE

The following communication streetcar service for Salem Heights was received by the Board of Trade: Mr. President and gentlemen of the Board of Trade of Salem, Or. It is with pleasure I have this opportunity of saying a few words upon a subject which not only is of great interest to us, but as we think, also of interest to you not only as a body but individually.

As you are no doubt all aware that we, the citizens of what is known as "Salem Heights," are endeavoring to bring about some method whereby we can induce the Portland Railway, Light & Power company to give us passenger service over their extended line now leading out to what is known as the Rock Quarry, or as far as the track is now laid on the Liberty road.

Mr. Lantz and myself (H. W. Smith) were appointed as delegates to go to Portland to interview the officials of said company. They met us very courteously but did not give us much encouragement, claiming they did not think it would be a paying proposition to them; also claiming the whole Salem car system was operated at a loss.

Now, gentlemen, we look at it like this: While said company has the track already laid and are daily using same for freight traffic, and we now have a population of about 500 men, women and children tributary to this line and who would patronize passenger service over same. By investigation we find 12 or 13 men now coming down town to work. Some drive, some by wheel, while others walk a distance of from three-quarters to a mile to catch the car at its present terminus. Also we find that without any great or extra effort upon said company they could extend the same car they are now running to Odd Fellows' cemetery, to the end of the line without extra help or additional expense. Now, gentlemen, we surely have an interest in this enterprise for it will not only be of great benefit to the patrons who live on the line but undoubtedly will be a great benefit to our beautiful little city of Salem.
