BUILDING EIGHT NEW SCHOOLS

An unprecedented era of activity in the building of school houses is in evidence in Marion county. County Superintendent Smith has received reports from eight districts where new buildings are being constructed. All of these will be completed when the fall term opens. Liberty, Mill City, and District 128, just north of Salem, are building four-room school houses, and Districts 99 and 22, also a few miles north of this city will have two-room structures. The other new buildings are in Champoeg and in Districts 93 and 95 near Silverton.

In nearly every school house in the county some kind of repairing is being done, in some cases the work amounting almost to complete reconstruction. New blackboards and seats are being installed in many of the old buildings, and the grounds and sidewalks are being improved. Altogether the coming term bids fair to be a most successful one, and the largest number of pupils ever enrolled in the county is expected when school opens next term.

It is feared, however, that the hop and prune harvesting season, which is about to open, will render the cannery short handed during the next few weeks.
