SALEM SHOULD GET A CARNEGIE LIBRARY SAYS PROFESSOR KIRK

Salem can have a \$25,000 Carnegie library whenever her people want it, and all we have to do is to install into our systems a little of the "new Salem spirit," and go to work. We are no slower as a class, let us hope, than the good people of Boise, Idaho; at least we shouldn't be. And yet while we have been fighting among ourselves over the site for the proposed library, and even considering the advisability of rejecting Mr. Carnegie's offer of \$14,000, Boise has built a \$25,000 library, one of the finest in the northwest.

But this is not the most remarkable thing. Those who have been laboring under the delusion that Mr. Carnegie's offer has not been liberal enough will have a surprise in store for them. In the first place the steel king's offer to Boise was no more generous than his offer to us. Mr. Carnegie promised Boise \$15,000 upon exactly the same terms that he promised Salem \$14,000, and Boise is larger than Salem. Repeated requests from Boise to Mr. Carnegie for more met with repeated refusals. Then Boise got to work. Her people raised \$5000 by subscription, and

began and completed the erection of a \$20,000 building. When this was done they found that they would need \$5000 more to furnish it. Again they appealed to Mr. Carnegie, with a statement of what they had done. Mr. Carnegie sent his agents out to Boise and when they reported back to him the man of millions was so delighted with the spirit of the Boise people that he not only gave them the \$5000 to furnish their building but he also paid them back the other \$5000 that they had raised by subscription.

This is the story that Professor W. E. Kirk of the Willamette university has brought back with him from Idaho. Professor and Mrs. Kirk have just returned from an extended visit to Boise and other Idaho cities, and while there the professor made a careful study of the library question, with special reference to the possibility of erecting a handsome Carnegie library in this city. Needless to say Professor Kirk is convinced that it can be done.

"What man has done man may do," and the Boise story shows pretty conclusively that man has done it. The moral is, "Get to work!"
