### CHILD LABOR REFORM.

Owen R. Lovejoy, 105 East 22nd street, New York, general secretary of the National Child Labor Reform Bureau, asks co-operation.

While many faddists catch onto every new reform idea that gets abroad, **THERE IS GREAT MERIT TO THE EFFORT TO PROTECT CHILDREN.**

The need of regulating the employment of children in factories is very great, and Oregon has taken the preliminary steps.

On the farms and in the homes child labor is beneficial when not carried too far, **BUT EVEN THERE IS DANGER OF ROBBING CHILDREN OF THEIR RIGHTS.**

The right of a child is to have fresh air, sufficient food, and decent clothing, but above all a fair chance at schooling.

The Liberty people once offered to grade the line to Liberty, if the company would lay the rails.
