



of economy. But during the past month the record of the department shows that it would have been more economical had their recommendations been granted.

If anyone believes that Pendleton has an inexpensive fire department. because it is a volunteer organization, he is sadly mistaken. Within the past month the firemen have earned approximately \$1000 in wages. Every time the fire bell rings, under our present "economical system it costs the city at least \$30 and. if the central companies turn out in force, \$45. Since the first of August the department has been called upon eight times and there has been practically 1000 hours of fire fighting. Firemen are paid a dollar an hour and when they turn out they are given credit for an hour's work even if they are not needed. They

would install an electric alarm system. These things would mean expense, perhaps to the extent of \$10,-000.

But the improvements would mean that in cases of fire an alarm could be given quickly and accurately. Only the necessary companies would be called out. An auto engine and driver would get into action quickly and therein lies the secret of firefighting. If the department had been properly equipped the fire at the


