For instance, the Oregon delegation in the national convention voted against every demand for popular reform, including the direct primary and the direct election of senators.

WHAT WARRANT HAD THOSE DELEGATES FOR OPPOSING POPULAR REFORMS IN THE NAME OF THE REPUBLICAN PARTY?

Who informed and instructed the delegation from Oregon that the people had gone back on those principles?

In Washington state NEARLY ALL THE OLD LEADERS ARE DISCARDED FOR OPPOSING THE SAME POPULAR DEMAND OF THE PEOPLE TO HAVE SOMETHING TO SAY.

The political machine calling itself the Republican organization and the Republican leadership naturally opposes invasion of its grafts.

Has there been a greater graft than the log-rolling conventions and THE ORDINARY LEGISLATIVE ELECTION OF U. S. SENATORS?

Like the old Whig party, that went under the dictation of the slave power, the Republican party seems to be going under the domination of machine slavery.

If it ceases to be responsive to popular demands of progress IT WILL GO THE WAY OF THE OLD WHIG PARTY.

But we do not believe such is the case. We believe the rank and file of the Republican party are true to the principles of progress.

They may be suppressed and overruled by the tricky methods of the machine managers, BUT SO MUCH THE WORSE FOR THOSE MANAGERS.

They will deal with them as fast

as they come to them, as they have done in Wisconsin, in Iowa, in Washington, and in Oregon.

A Republican organization responsive to the popular will, **STANDING FOR THE PROGRESSIVE POLICIES WHICH THE PEOPLE HAVE ENACTED**, is badly needed in Oregon.

The leadership and the political machinery that seeks to reverse every reform demand made by the people will fight a losing battle.

Republican leadership can get about so far away from the people **AND THEN IT IS WIPED OFF THE SLATE AND NEW LEADERS ACCEPTED.**

The mere political pie-hunter who changes front with each change of his own appetite for new plunder, is not a political leader.

YAKIMA VALLEY

lower prices, of course, consumption will be greatly increased.

"The crop of peaches is short on some of the lower lands on account of the frost and damage from aphids, but owing to the increased acreage of new orchards, the output of peaches this season will be something of an increase over last season. Present estimates indicate the output of peaches will be about 250 cars.

"Apples, of course, are the big end of the fruit crop in the Yakima valley, fully two-thirds of the 2500 cars of fruit this season being fall and winter apples. The apples here this year are entirely free from worms, scale and any disease. The fruitgrowers have made large money in the past few years and given careful attention to spraying, spraying thoroughly in the winter with Rex lime and sulphur spray, and spraying thoroughly and just as the bloom is falling with arsenate of lead for the codling moth. Gravenstein apples are now being picked and shipped to Alaska and points in British Columbia.

"Growers and dealers are not looking for the extravagantly high prices of last year. They are expecting from \$1.25 to \$1.50 for fancy export varieties and 60 cents to \$1 for medium varieties, such as Black Twig, Rome Beauty, Wagner, etc. Jonathans will be ready for shipment the last of September and are going to show, from present indications, elegant color and quality. All varieties are a full crop and the estimated shipments of apples will be 1600 cars of 600 boxes each."—Ex.

INVESTIGATES SANTIAM MINING DISTRICT.

A representative of the Albany Herald recently made a trip into the portion of Linn and Marion counties known as the North Fork of the Santiam Mining District. Much has been written and said heretofore as to the value of this district in the matter of a force of 60 men at work extending this writer can only report some of the things which have already been told, but which he actually saw, and which must be admitted, was to him somewhat of a surprise.

At the Black Eagle mine unprecedented activity is manifest. Not only are scores of men at work in the mine but improvements are being made which will give the district much better transportation facilities.

The Black Eagle people alone have a force of 60 men at work extending the present wagon road from Elkhorn to their property, a distance of four miles to the mines. The new road will give the miners a good exit to the town of Gates, on the Corvallis & Eastern railroad, which is the shipping point for the district.

The completion of this road means the establishment of a smelter in the district at once. A few of the largest companies have bonded together for this purpose. The building of the smelter will necessarily include the construction of a big power plant. With the smelter constructed, the companies plan to double their force of workmen and rush the development of the mines rapidly.

The output of this district will justify a railroad in the near future, and representatives of a transportation company made an investigating trip into the district only a short time ago to ascertain the best route for their company to build into this rich mineral section. There has been a rumor current at the mines that the Corvallis & Eastern would run a branch from Gates into the district. It is now believed that an electric line is projected to run from the mines to Gates and connect with the C. & E. There is also talk of an electric line from Salem.

The district is rich in minerals, gold and copper predominating. These are found in paying quantities and lead and some silver have also been uncovered.

There are now four mines being operated—the Gold Creek, Freeland Consolidated, Electric and the Black Eagle. Development work will begin on several other properties with the completion of the new road.

The mines of this district are owned principally by Portland and local capitalists.

THE NEW WOMAN

APPEARS IN TURKEY
 In the recent rejoicings at the proclamation of a constitution in Turkey many Turkish women took part, and for the first time in history appeared in public without their veils.

They have appealed to the Young Turk party to abolish the harem system, and with it the compulsory

veiling of women. The word harem is Arabic for anything forbidden or not to be touched as against the rules of the Koran. Games of chance, witchcraft and portrait making are "harem."

In practice the word is used by Europeans to designate that portion of a polygamist's house which is devoted to the exclusive occupancy of his wives and their attendants. Thence it comes to refer to the female portion of his household, while the word may be used by westerners to designate the system of plurality of wives.

In Turkey the system has been maintained not only as a part of the Moslem religion, but as an integral part of the Mohammedan polity, of which the sultan is the chief spiritual head, to whom all orthodox Muslims look up and to whom, as the appointer of Sheikh-ul-Islam, all religious questions may be finally referred.

Whether the sultans will follow the lead of their subjects in this matter is very doubtful. The harem system is so interwoven with court life and government of a Mohammedan ruler that it would take a strong man to break through the rule, even if he desired to do so.

The etiquette of the harem of the sultan of Turkey, like that of most Moslem potentates, is very severe and is strictly carried out. Each wife has her own suit of apartments, her own bathroom and garden, and her own body of servants, male and female. The wives are not called by their names, but as distinguished as Kadis (or lady) No. 1 and so on.

The title of sultana is given only to the mother, sister or daughter of a sultan, consequently it is the Kadis who first gives birth to an heir to the throne who can have this distinction. Should an adolisk, or female slave of the harem, become the mother of her lord's first born son, then she becomes the reigning Sultana. Even then she has little influence, this being wielded alone by the sultan's mother, the Sultana Valide, who controls the harem and exercises considerable influence in all court and many governmental matters.—Town and Country.
