Wasson sanyon is the next point to be visited by a junketing party from this city, which will be composed of councilmen, business men, editors and others. The party will leave at 6 o'clock Wednesday morning and will spend the day visiting the various sources of supply proposed in that neighborhood.

The trip to the Little Applegate proved of so much benefit in acquainting the various councilmen and business men as to the merits and demerits of the offer made by the Sterling mine company that a second trip was proposed, and many have signified their intention of making the trip, among them being Mayor J. F. Reddy, Councilmen Effert, Hafer, Olwell and Editors Bliton and Putman. F. Osenbrugge has charge of the arrangements and will also be one of the party. Shorty Hamilton will also probably make the trip.

The party will first visit Wasson canyon and the Slinger ranch. Then they will look over the Fish lake proposition. The water in all instances will be tested as to its quality and quantity. The engineering problems will not be debated to any great extent by the laymen, but will be left to the engineers.

Other members of the council who are on the special water committee will probably not make the trip, as they are familiar at the present time with all the features of the various propositions.
