FINDS SON IS DEAD AFTER LONG SEARCH

A communication was received yesterday by Tommy Cauffield, the well known bookkeeper for the Eckerlen wholesale liquor house here, from a Mrs. Hennessy, of Ingersoll Ontario, Canada, wishing to know the cost of a tombstone for her son, Nicholas, who died on a farm near Rickreall, 25 years ago. Mrs. Hennessy's son left his home in Canada over 35 years ago and she was unaware of his location and death until within the past few months when she was notified by a Halpin, whom she had sent to find him.

Halpin arrived here about two months ago, and upon inquiring of Father Moore, of the Catholic church, was directed to Cauffield, whose father and mother were well acquainted with the deceased, he having been in the employ of Cauffield, Sr., for a number of months on his farm near Rickreall. Hennessy died at a boarding place near the Cauffield ranch and was buried in the Catholic cemetery south of this city. Mrs. Hennessy states she is a widow and without means to attend to the matters by making the trip to the west, and for this reason she has asked Cauffield to kindly lend her some aid which he has done.

PAPKE MAY MIX WITH HUGO KELLY

San Francisco, Sept. 12.—There is a good chance that Billy Papke, middleweight champion will fight Hugo Kelly at Los Angeles before the Ketchel here on Thanksgiving evening. T. E.
