

EXPRESS COMPANY RESISTS LANE COUNTY TAX

(Eugene Register.)
Suits have been commenced in the circuit court entitled Wells Fargo & Co., plaintiff, vs. Lane county, Oregon, and Harry Brown, its sheriff and tax collector, defendant; the purpose of which is to resist the payment of the tax levied against the express company last year on its rights and privileges. Upon application of the plaintiff Judge Harris issued the following

Order.
This cause coming on to be heard on the verified complaint of the plaintiff's counsel and counsel for the defendant, having stated that they do not desire to resist the application for preliminary restraining order it is ordered that until further order of this court, the defendants do refrain and desist from taking any measures for collection of a tax undertaken to be levied against plaintiff on transportation rights and privileges over 75.90 miles and that until the further order of this court the defendants do particularly refrain and desist from issuing execution and from selling any property of plaintiff for the collection of any tax levied in Lane county, Oregon, for the year 1907. It is ordered that this injunction issue only in the filing of a bond in a manner and form as required by law, in the sum of \$350, to be approved by this court and that upon the approval of such bond the injunction do issue for service.

ARTESIAN WELLS FOR OREGON ORCHARDS

(Medford Tribune.)
A deal is being negotiated by which a lease will be taken on the Gore place on the "desert" and an attempt made to get artesian water in that part of the valley, and with the water turn the desert land into a productive section of the valley. Colonel Mundy, who is in the city negotiating for the coal mine southeast of Medford, is the principal man in the company and is negotiating the deal.

The land known as the "desert" northeast of the city has been passed up in the past by all fruit growers in the valley, owing to its dryness. There is no doubt but that with water the desert will be transformed into a veritable garden of Eden.

It is a current report that Colonel Mundy is also to bore for oil in that part of the valley, but the colonel denies this, saying that he only contemplates trying for artesian water.

Colonel Mundy is of the opinion that there will be but little difficulty in striking flowing water in that neighborhood, as in all like localities nature provides some way of overcoming dryness. The colonel has figured out that the only solution of this problem will be to strike artesian water.
