MORDED CHINA U. S. TREATY

(United Press Lensed Wire.)

Sept. 17.—The Japanese government is today watching the contents of a New York newspaper and his Chinese friends very closely. It is given out here that the American is trying to make a treaty to down the influence of Japan in the Pacific.

Japanese spies who have been in Hong Kong to report the contents of the New York newspaper today reported to the government that he and the editor of the Chinese Mail were to arrange the treaty, protesting that the original overtures were from the Chinese.

The Japanese government is working over the affair and it is possible that the Japanese government is asked to take some action.

QUEEN HASTENS WEDDING OF DUKE AND AMERICAN

(United Press Lensed Wire.)

Rome, Sept. 17.—That Queen Margherita made a tactical blunder in her denunciation of the proposed marriage of the Duke of Abruzzi to Miss Catherine Elkins and her intention that the duke was in the class of titled European fortune hunters, is admitted today by both the advocates and opponents of the marriage.

Realizing, as she must have done, that the duke could not be dissuaded from his purpose, the queen erred, court circles say, in driving the duke's family into open resentment by her vehement reception of the plea of the Count Turin, who came to her as an emissary from his brother, seeking to win the queen's consent.

The count's defense of his brother's fiancée and his defiant declaration that his own mother, Princess Letitia Bonaparte, descended from a family not of royal blood, and yet was good enough to sit on the throne of Spain for five years as the consort of King Amadeus, was a bold stroke, and will likely result in a lasting rupture in the royal household.

The result of the interview between the count and queen will likely hasten the wedding, rather than delay it. The wedding had been set for January 29, the duke's birthday anniversary, but it is said now that he will temporarily relinquish his command of the Regina Flens and hasten to America, to urge an earlier marriage.

MACHINE DEFEATS

REFORM JUDGE

San Francisco, Sept. 17.—The Democrats of this city and the Lincoln-Roosevelt League are today preparing to make Frank Dunn, the judge who sentenced Ruef and Schmits to jail, an issue in the campaign for the superior bench.

Judge Dunn was turned down for the Republican nomination at the Republican convention here last night. His name was presented amid hoots and jeers from the "regular" delegates to the convention and wild cheering from the galleries and spectators.

The Republicans nominated Judge John Hunt, George A. Sturtevant and John J. Van Nostrand without any opposition for the long term, and Isadore Golden for the short term, but the fight came when Judge Dunn was placed in opposition to Judge Cayroll Cook.

After scenes of disorder, Cook received 110 votes and Dunne 64. The Lincoln-Roosevelt League says that they will support Dunne, if he is nominated by the Democrats.

NELSON TURNS DOWN

OFFER FOR \$10,000

San Francisco, Sept. 17.—Battling Nelson is not anxious to fight just at present. He has received several offers from magnates during the past few days, and this morning stated that he is going to stick to the stage for a time.

"I am making a big hit in the Central theatre just at present," said Nelson, "and I am not anxious to get back into the ring until something good turns up."

Nelson received a wire from Harry D. Edwards, of the National Club of Philadelphia, offering a purse of \$10,000 if he would fight Packey McParland a six-round go during Founder's Week, the first week in October. Nelson thought about the matter all night, and this morning wired Edwards that he would not accept the offer. The Dane does not like short fights.
