ORGANIZED SEARCH FOR KIDNAP GIRLS

Chicago, Ill., Sept. 18.—The "kidnap" squad of detectives organized yesterday, under special orders from Chief of Police Shippy, to search for missing girls, today began active work in the running down of clues that might lead to the arrest of the gang of kidnapers that has been working in this city for the past month. Fifteen girls have been lost in 30 days, and it is believed they were all kidnaped. The girls range from 13 to 19 years in age, and all were attractive and of good family. Chief Shippy said today that a special squad of detectives will be maintained until the girls are found. He is determined to put a stop to the kidnaping that has been going on here, terrorizing residents for the past two months.

RESCUE CHINESE GIRL FROM SLAVERY (United Press Leased Wire.) Vallejo, Cal., Sept. 18.—The Chinese of this city are today making a fight to regain possession of Moe Kim, a pretty 9-year-old Chinese girl, who was brought to this country on the Korea last July to be sold into slavery, and who was rescued here yesterday from a box, in which she had been smuggled from San Francisco. Donaldina Cameron, superintendent of the Presbyterian Mission Home for Chinese girls, learned of the arrival of Moe Kim in San Francisco, together with her sister, aged 14. She obtained letters of guardianship from the superior court of Solano county, and traced Moe Kim here. The police found the girl in a box in the Chinese quarter. The Chinese say today that they will leave nothing undone to regain possession of the girl.

TO TRY BOY CAUFFEUR FOR MANSLAUGHTER (United Press Leased Wire.) San Francisco, Sept. 18.—It is probable that Edward Oswald, a youth, aged 15, will have to stand trial for manslaughter for having run over and killed Lewis Barlow, aged 16 while Oswald was driving an automobile. The Oswald boy was driving an automobile belonging to the Contra Costa Canning Company, and, after he had run over his victim, he did not stop to learn the nature of the boy's injuries. He was later arrested and put in a detention home. The coroner's jury last night returned a verdict declaring that the Barlow boy's death was due to Oswald's carelessness, and branding him as incompetent to run a machine.
