## TRACK AND STATE RECORDS ARE SMASHED

Records both on the track and in the grandstand were broken yesterday afternoon at the State Fair grounds, the track records for the three-year-old trotters being cut down from the Northwest record of 2:11 1/2 to 2:09 1/4 by Ray O' Light in the race of the Mountain and Valley purse of three-year-olds, stake \$500. In the 2:14 trot, the big \$5000 purse, Day Break smashed the state record in the 2:14 class, making the mile in 2:10 1/4. The crowd in attendance at yesterday's events, was larger than that of Wednesday's big Salem Day turnout.

The first race on the program for the afternoon, was the three-year-old trot with a purse of \$500 which was won by Ray O' Light in two straight heats out of three. Mortrix and Cora put up a splendid exhibition for second money, but the second stake was equally divided between the two owing to the fact they both won a second and third place in the race. Pet Palestine got fourth money. The time made in the two heats was 2:09 1/4 for the first and 2:10 1/4 for the second. The respective drivers were Pet Palestine (Hollinshead), Mortrix, (Chadburn), Ray O' Light, (Whitehead) and Cora, (Wallace).

The 2:16 pacing race was number two on the scheduled events, with a purse of \$800. The stake was won by Josephine in three straight heats out of the five. Driver Rutherford of Josephine was forced to use his best judgment in this event, as Ken West, driven by Hogoboom, Tom Murphy, driven by Chadburn and Alt driven by Sawyer were driving their stock with intention of gaining a victory every minute. The time made in this race was, for the first heat 2:09, second heat 2:09 1/4, and the third and last heat 2:09 1/4. Josephine got first money in the race, Tom Murphy second money, Ken West third money and The Indian, driven by Hoag, fourth money. Perry Maurey drove his horse Zomorte in this event, but could get only sixth place in the first heat, seventh in the second and fifth in the third.

Race number three afforded the most interest in the harness class during the afternoon. This event called for trotters with a record as good or better than 2:14. The Lewis and Clark stake of \$5000 was won by Day Break, driven by McGuire in three straight heats out of five. The horses and drivers in this fast event were: Nogi (Walton), Crilla Jones (Payne), Satin Royal (Erwin), Lady W., (Hogoboom), Berta Mac (Helman), Emmy W (Ward), Della Derby (Whitehead), Easter Bells (Vance), Day Break (McGuire), Helen Dare (Beckers), Vallejo Girl (Burke), and Richie Baron (Mitchell). Day Break was a hard winner of the stake, he being crowded closely by Vallejo Girl and Nogi and Berta Mac. The three heats were long and tedious due to mishaps and the large field to score. Helman with Berta Mac and Whitehead with Della Derby hooked wheels on the stretch at one time, and both drivers had a narrow escape from injury. Both carts were put out of commission, and Mr. Helman was compelled to lay off for a short time in order to get in driving shape again. The time made in these heats was: First heat, 2:11 1/4; second heat, 2:10 1/4 and the third heat in 2:12 flat. Day Break got first money, Vallejo Girl second money, Berta Mac third money and Nogi fourth money.

The little guideless pacing mare College Maid, also broke all previous records made by her on the Lone Oak track. The intelligent little animal cut her mark to 2:09 flat. Her former mark made here was 2:10 flat. She made the first half mile in fast time, it being 1:01 flat.

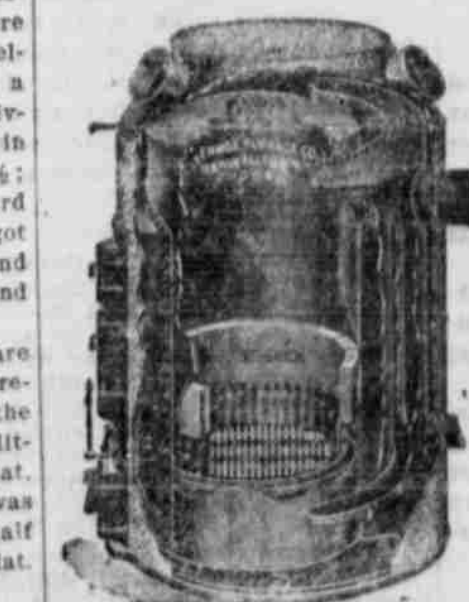
