OF O. BULLETIN ON HIGH SCHOOLS

The Journal is just in receipt of the September number of the University of Oregon Bulletin, which treats of "Country High School Organization and Training of Teachers," and is one of the most valuable bulletins recently issued by the university for those interested in the betterment of our rural schools. It contains an exhaustive account of the methods adopted by other states for the training of teachers, and discusses fully the so-called Lane county plan for the establishment of country high schools. To quote from it: "This plan will allow country districts to organize high schools, so that tuition is to be paid by the whole county. The country high school can have as good a teacher as the city high school. Inasmuch as this plan allows any enterprising district to start a high school it does away with the necessity of a vote. The trouble with the union high school law is that it requires a majority vote of all the districts before the high school is started." Under its working, some four or five high schools are being established in Lane county in places where it was impossible to maintain them before. A small county tax is levied and each high school student, regardless of location, draws his share of the tax; the more high school students, the

more money the districts draws from the county. Under this law, country high schools can be established in every group of districts in the state that is not over 12 miles in extent, and that has 15 or 20 pupils that can attend high school. The legal form necessary to secure a vote is given, and the bulletin can be secured free by writing to the Registrar of the University.

MILK CONDENSER FOR CITY OF ALBANY

(Albany Herald.) At a meeting of the Commercial club last night the milk condenser was endorsed and now it seems assured that the city will have a plant of this character for which it has waited so long a time. The committee to whom the matter of investigating the condensery was referred, reported favorably as follows: We find upon investigation that

the facts set forth in a prospectus issued by Messrs. J. A. Howard and C. W. Teabault fully explain and cover the proposition.

We also find that a condensed milk plant is warranted in Albany, and worthy of support by our citizens; that the promotion fee of 8 per cent on \$4,000, of the capital stock of the proposed organization is not excessive, nor more than will be fully earned, for labor and expense to thoroughly execute the project. That as evidence of faith, the members of the Commercial club, have already subscribed \$5,000 to the capital stock.


That, when the stock has been sufficiently subscribed to insure success, the subscribers are to elect whom they deem proper as directors and officers of the association, who will have power and authority as such officers and directors to select grounds, purchase machinery, enter into contracts necessary for the establishment of a plant, and to have entire control of the plant, regulated by by-laws sanctioned by the association.

We therefore, recommend that hearty support be given by our citizens and the project be encouraged and pushed to early completion.
