DUE TO THE LAVISH USE OF MONEY IN THE PRIMARY CAMPAIGN.

In Oregon last April Senator Fulton was beaten at the Republican primaries by Henry M. Cake, but as a majority of the members of the legislature chosen in June are pledged to vote for the SENATORIAL CANDIDATE RECEIVING THE LARGEST POPULAR VOTE, GOV. CHAMBERLAIN, A DEMOCRAT, IS ENTITLED TO ELECTION, although the Republicans control the legislature.

The Missouri senatorial contest between the two Democratic candidates, Senator Stone and Gov. Folk WILL BE DECIDED BY A DIRECT VOTE AT THE POLLS IN NOVEMBER.

The adoption of the primary system by western states in the nomination of senatorial candidates HAS RESULTED IN NEARLY EVERY CASE THIS YEAR IN THE RETIREMENT OF THE PRESENT INCUMBENT and in the choice of a more radical successor.

But the day of reckoning is coming fast for other alleged Republican leaders.

The corporation-controlled, BOUGHT-AND-PAID-FOR UNITED STATES SENATOR MUST GO.

So must all the politicians who have heaped up riches out of grafts in the name of Republicanism.

Foraker has always thrown rocks at Roosevelt, AND WAS OPPOSED TO TAFT.

The leading machine politicians of Oregon have all been cursing Roosevelt and have no use for Taft.

If it had been left to a direct vote of the people NONE BUT ROOSEVELT DELEGATES HAD GONE TO THE NATIONAL CONVENTION.

The great thing to the credit of Taft is that the machine gang are at heart not for him.

At Salem they did not want to allow Taft's name to be used IN THE FORMATION OF A REPUBLICAN CLUB.

But the United States senate is being weeded out of bought-up and paid-for senators, and it ought to be.

Reading the following summary from the New York World, as to the way the old idols of the corrupt system are being killed off:

(Notice where the people get a vote at the direct primary they kill them off.)

The defeat at the state primaries of Senator Ankeny, of Washington, for renomination by Representative Wesleye L. Jones adds one more to a significant series of changes in the membership of the senate.

The spirit of radicalism has taken possession of the west, and in half a dozen states where the Republicans have been in the ascendancy the railroad and corporation issues this year HAVE PRODUCED A REVOLUTION WITHIN PARTY LINES.

Although a handful of stand-patters in the Iowa legislature have succeeded so far in holding up the election of Gov. Cummins to succeed the late Senator Allison, there can be no doubt about the state of public sentiment.

The anti-Cummins faction has been too often beaten in previous contests with the radical element, and in the pending fight Gov. Cummins lacks only 13 votes of an election.

At the June primaries in North Dakota Senator Hansbrough, who is serving his third term, of four Republican candidates for the senate ran third.

He is out of the race. Under the North Dakota law the two leading candidates at the primaries, T. F. Marshall and M. N. Johnson, will have their names on the ballots at the November election, AND THE ONE RECEIVING THE MAJORITY AT THAT ELECTION WILL RECEIVE THE PARTY VOTE IN THE LEGISLATURE.

In South Dakota Senator Kittredge, the leader of the stalwart faction, who was a candidate for re-election, was defeated at the primaries in June by Gov. Crawford, LEADER OF THE PROGRESSIVE REPUBLICANS, ON THE CORPORATION ISSUE.

The victory of Joseph L. Bristow last month in Kansas over Senator Long was won after a sharp campaign in which Long suffered because of the popular belief that HE IS TOO CONSERVATIVE AND SYMPATHETIC TOWARDS THE RAILROADS.

At the Illinois primaries in August Senator Hopkins barely escaped being beaten by Representative Foss, who may yet carry the contest into the next legislature.

Senator Stephenson, of Wisconsin, the wealthy lumberman, although he has been identified with the La Follette wing of the party, was opposed by other radical candidates, and his winning vote, it is charged, WAS
