

REPORT OF THE WEATHER FORECASTER

General Summary. The night temperature west of the Cascade mountains averaged considerably below the normal, while the afternoon temperatures were slightly below the seasonal average. In the eastern portion of the state the nights were warm and the days cool, due to the cloudy weather. Wednesday and Thursday were cool throughout the state, and light frost occurred on those mornings in sections of the Willamette and Umpqua valleys. Light rain was general over the state on Tuesday, and good showers fell in the eastern portion on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. Wednesday, the Cascade mountains and west of the rain was well distributed, no heavy showers being reported from any locality. The sun-shine was about normal in the western portion of the state, but there was much cloudiness in the eastern counties till Saturday. No damaging high winds occurred. Coast District. Newport, Lincoln county, Jno. E. Baldwin. Fine weather prevailed during the week, but the nights were cool. No rain fell. Prineville, Crook county, C. I. Winkler. The week was cool, with a light frost on the morning of the 17th, which cut down tender vegetation. Dry weather continues and rain is much needed. Willamette Valley. Portland, Multnomah county, local weather bureau. The fore part of the week was cloudy, with a trace of rain Tuesday. Wednesday, Thursday and Friday were clear and pleasant. THE COMMERCE OF THE PACIFIC OCEAN

There can be but one idea in the mind of any statesman of no matter what country and that is to extend, develop and protect the foreign commerce of his own country. No European power nor America, can afford to permit a small nation occupying three or four islands in the Pacific ocean to absorb and control the entire commerce of the vast Chinese empire, and this is only to be prevented by an immediate combination of the European powers and America in defense of the integrity of that empire. "Talking of China, she is now pursuing the same policy that developed Japan." The Herald contained a few days ago the report of a meeting of 143 Chinese students in the American universities, at which they endorsed the proposal of a treaty between China and America. What does this mean? It means there are 143 Chinese being civilized for the service of the government of China with the purpose of improving and advancing the present condition of that country. "There are just as many in other parts of the world, and when these students finish their education they are going to do what Japan students have done." They will return to China with modern ideas and will set about reorganizing the government with modern ideas and the rotten methods of government will be wiped out, and China, instead of being split up into a number of petty individual and almost independent provincial governments, will become a homogeneous nation under one strong, central government. If China had any such government worth the name, and the people were taught national patriotism, it would not be necessary for any nation to reach out its hand to protect her. The regeneration of China is coming as surely as the setting of the sun, and those who know see it already.—M. H. De Young, in interview in Paris, New York Herald.
