REFORESTRATION AND THE WATERSHEDS

But while forest preservation is the prime and durable water conserving the reforestation of now wholly or partially denuded watersheds is the work of many years—yes, of generations, and even the present forest area can be maintained only by the promptest and most vigorous preservation policy. The annual growth of timber is not sufficient to replenish what is consumed; it does not exceed 60 board feet per acre or 30,000,000,000 feet from the entire area, while the lumber output alone exceeds this quantity in 1903; to this is to be added some 12,000,000,000 feet for shingles, cross-ties, pulpwood, cooperage stock, mine timber, lath, veneering, poles, and for distillation.

And this is only the known consumption; there is yet to be reckoned that for firewood, some 100,000,000 cords or 50,000,000,000 feet, and last but not least what is destroyed by the forest fires which have been estimated as high as 12,000,000 acres in one year. The total timber consumption therefore is nearly three times that of the annual new growth, and unless this is more nearly balanced very soon, water conservation by the aid of the forests does not look very promising for the near future, that is for 50 years or more to come.

In the meantime the destruction and waste goes on unchecked; the floods will occur annually and will increase in violence rather than diminish; the sometimes navigable channels will be choked up quite as regularly by the detritus washed down from the bare hill sides, and the water powers of the stream, which alone might be of sufficient earning capacity to pay for all the reasonable and economically practicable flow-control works, are hardly of any utility because of the uncertainty of the available flow.

Prompt relief can be had only from one program, which comprises the storing of the largest practicable flood run-off per cent, and the distribution of this quantity during the dry season, in this manner only can flow control be had within a reasonable period of time, and some abatement of flood destruction and some betterment of power conditions will be realized from each effort.—H. von Schon, in Engineering Magazine.

IDIOTCY IN RURAL ENGLISH VILLAGES

Many interesting facts relating to the condition of rural England are mentioned in the reports of some of the doctors appointed by the royal commission on the care and control of the feeble-minded to investigate the mental condition of the people of the kingdom. The reports are contained in the sixth volume of the report of the commission, which was issued recently.

In Wiltshire Dr. James Pearce found some villages still remote from the tide of life and self-contained. In several districts close intermarriage has been the rule, so that one, he says, has often been told that all the people in a village are related to one another. The average wage is 12s. to 14s. often without a house.

Dr. Pearce says that in villages in the neighborhood of large estates the proportion of mentally defective is less and the average ability is higher, than in the purely agricultural village. A similar comment is made by Dr. Bernard Stacey in his report on Lincolnshire. His explanation is that the land-lord proprietor does not want defective workmen, he can afford to pick and choose his men; also it is not pleasant to have idiots or imbeciles in the village, so the feeble-minded have to go.

Speaking general of Lincolnshire, Dr. Stacey says the means of communication are very bad, and to this he attributes the low average intelligence of the country people, many of whom have hardly been away from their own village all their lives. Dr. Samuel E. Gill in a report on Nottinghamshire, has something to say on the drinking habit in colliery districts. He has it on the authority of one who had had many years' experience of colliery life that quite 50 per cent of the men drink considerable more than is good for them on Saturday nights, and that quite half the remainder would do better with less. Dr. Gill, however, points out that men engaged in heavy laborious occupations can take a much larger quantity of spirit or beer without the serious physical effects that the same quantity would have on those whose work is only light, and "also that a weekly drinking bout is less injurious to the human tissues than continuous 'soaking.'"
