## "MAN OF THE HOUR" COMING

"The Man of the Hour," George Broadhurst's new play, will be seen here at the Grand opera house on Wednesday night.

"The Man of the Hour" is a timely play, full of dramatic incidents, with plenty of comedy and telling a story of human interest.

It deals with one of the most burning topics of the day. The "grafting" of the political "machine" in many of the great cities of this country is the central theme of the story, the particular delineation being the passage through the city council of the town where the action of the play takes place of a bill giving a perpetual franchise to a street railway.

The mayor's signature is all that is necessary to make the bill a fact, and the "machine" has elected to the office, after a hard fight, a rich young man who they thought could be easily "handled." He proves honest, however, and although all kinds of pressure are brought to bear steadfastly refuses to make the proposed measure a law.

The love interest in "The Man of the Hour," is that of the young man for the niece of the financier who is responsible for the bill. She has told her lover that in order to win her hand he must prove worthy, but it is at the risk of jeopardizing her fortune and losing her as well that the young man keeps up the fight of his life against the "bosses."

Mr. Broadhurst has utilized in the making of his play many incidents which in the past few months have come to public knowledge through the newspapers of the country, and which, when put upon the stage have great dramatic value.

## BEAUTIFUL GEMETERY STRUCTURE

N. A. Tibbitts, an eastern granite man, representing Otto Schuman of Portland, has closed a contract with the executors of the estate of the late Tilmon Ford for a mausoleum to be erected on the Ford burial lot in Odd Fellows cemetery in Salem.

The structure is to be built of granite and stone. The vestibule is to be lined throughout with polished Italian marble. The facade is embellished with polished granite columns with carved capitals supporting the portico with an entrance door of copper bronze, the upper portion of which will be of heavy plate glass protected by a bronze grill. The rear window will contain an art glass also protected by a grill.

This mausoleum will be the first of its class constructed in the Willamette valley embodying as it does all the scientific principals used in modern structures of this class.

Mr. Tibbitts states the work will be completed about April 1, 1909.
