## INCREASE IN COUNTY SCHOOLS

Superintendent Smith of the county schools sent out the apportionments to the clerks of the county school districts for the month yesterday, and the total amounts apportioned shows an increase over those of last year. The total for the county schools is \$80,505.77, an increase of \$991.77. The state school funds were apportioned \$17,026.80 this year which amount shows an increase of \$894.80 over that of last year. This increase is due to the \$1 per capita originated by the last legislative assembly.

The county fund apportioned to each school district is \$50 and to each pupil of the respective districts \$5.20.

Several districts have reported the attendance, and the following table will show the number of attendance in percentage and district of each school reported to date:

## FIRST CONVICTION UNDER CALIFORNIA ANTI-TRUST LAWS

Sacramento, Cal., Oct. 7.—Attorneys for the Western Meat Company are preparing an appeal today from the decision of a jury that last night found J. W. O'Keefe, local manager of the company guilty of violating the Cartwright anti-trust law. This is the first conviction under the California law, and the attorneys are preparing to take an appeal on the ground that the law is unconstitutional.

The specific charge against O'Keefe was that he conspired with the Sacramento Butchers' Protective Association to charge Albert Robinson, an independent butcher, high rates for his meat, to restrict his trade. The testimony showed that because Robinson refused to join the association he was charged higher prices by the meat company than the members of the association were charged. The jury was out two hours. Two more cases against the Western Meat Company and one against the Butchers' Protective Association are pending.
