

# CHARITY WORK IN OREGON

The Oregon conference of Charities and Corrections begins in Portland, October 11. The following information has been sent out concerning this good work:

### Foreword.

The directors of the board of the Oregon conference of Charities and Correction herewith announce that a conference of that body will meet in the city of Portland on October 11-13. These dates have been chosen some days in advance of the time first intended, in order to secure the attendance and co-operation of some of the leaders of philanthropy who will be at the Washington conference of October 5-8. In particular the committee is happy to state that the Hon. Samuel J. Barrows, of New York city, secretary of the prison commission, and also president of the International Prison Congress, has consented to take part in our conference, and also Mrs. Isabella C. Barrows, his wife. Among other themes in which Dr. Barrows will lead the conference especial prominence will be given to the essentials of a true reformatory system, both for men and for women. The committee is speeding this foreword of invitation to all workers in institutions of charities and correction, and to as many as possible of those interested in philanthropy, urging them to attend this important conference during the days named, October 11-13. Full program will be published in a few days.

Meeting will probably be held in the chapel of the Church of Our Father, Seventh and Yamhill streets.

There will be a conference sermon and address, probably in some church of this city, on Sunday evening, October 11, and three sessions each for the 12th and 13th, the evenings being platform meetings with leading speakers and a reception. Among the subjects upon which it is hoped Dr. and Mrs. Barrows will address us while here is their visit of a few months since to Count Leo Tolstol, with a review of Russian affairs.
